○ Webster (East and West)

- **1650** Thomas Hammond began farming the eastern section.
- cs 1852 <u>Railroad line, now the MBTA</u>, built. (Hammond Brook Canal went under)
- cs 1896 Edwin Webster bought the land and lived at 307 Hammond Street
- cs 1916 Webster gave 38 acres of the southern half to the State.
- cs 1935 Webster donated 7-acre playground at end of Warren St to the city.
- cs 1954 ~25 acres sold by the state to Congregation Mishkan Tefila.
- cs 1968-1979 City took portions of Webster & Houghton lands for conservation

en Elgin Conservation Area

Charles Cohen Conservation Area

cs 1972 City bought Webster Vale (later became CCCA). 7.6-ac plus 1.6-acre annex

ca Deer Park

- cs 14.06-acre parcel once contained ~40 deer
- Acquired with understanding the City would care for the deer. MA Wildlife wanted the deer released. City used darted contraceptive implants each spring.
- s The last deer died in the winter of 2010-2011
