

Needham Street/Oak Street (Buildings 12, 13 and 14)

At a scheduled meeting and public hearing on October 26, 2017, the Newton Historical Commission, by a vote 6-0:

RESOLVED to support removal of the three previously preferably-preserved buildings at 12, 13 and 14 Tower Road in deference to a proposed site plan that will enhance views of the existing assemblage of historically significant buildings at 156 Oak Street. Henceforth, the buildings numbered 12, 13, and 14 are not preferably preserved. In addition, the choice to preserve and enhance the existing historic buildings at 156 Oak Street opens the way to immediate negotiations on mitigation measures with the owner and the Massachusetts Historical Commission. Historic materials and site enhancements on the historic mill complex will serve to educate the public on the historic role played by the Saco Pettee Mills in the history of Newton and Upper Falls.
