





Overview of FY2021 - FY2025 CIP

- 217 Total Projects
- 106 with projected spending during FY2020 FY2025 Period (6 Years)
- 14 project deletions, 26 project additions from FY2020 CIP + many changes
- \$287 million in projected spending during FY2021-FY2025, from <u>all</u> funding sources
- \$63 million in projected spending remaining to be docketed in Fy2020
- Project Breakdown by Asset Category
 - 125 Building projects
 - 22 Complete Streets projects
 - 22 Parks & Open Space projects
 - 10 Sewer projects
 - 15 Stormwater projects
 - 9 Large Equipment projects

- Site Plan Approval in July 2019
- Fall 2021 Move-In
- All Electric Systems (no fossil fuels)
- Drop Off and Pick Up designed for Program
- New Main Entrance
- Designed for mobility and sensory needs of population
- Modulars removed
- Designed for 305 Students and 85-105 Staff
- \$13 million



Horace Mann

- \$20m investment made in 2014+2019 but...
- \$500k planned for 2nd floor classroom sinks and playground improvements
- School Department commitment for classroom furnishings
- Additional work under consideration
- Ideas of parents and educators



Oak Hill Middle School Space Solution

3-Classroom Permanent Addition + 1 Interior Classroom

- \$3 million with NPS paying \$500k design
- Attempt to get Site Plan Approval, design and construction done in two years
- 3-classroom addition likely in front of gym on NPS land (not impacting fields)

Newton Public Schools – Future Major Capital Projects

Highest Priority Schools: Countryside, Franklin & Ward



Countryside School

- ½ school is old modulars
- School built in wetlands, leading to frequent, serious flooding and chronic dampness
- Many support spaces do not exist, or not large enough
- Building systems need replacement



Franklin School

- Use of basement spaces for educational purposes not good
- Poorly design additions and use of basement creates disconnection
- Building systems beyond useful life and need replacement



Ward School

- Significant accessibility problems
- 1928 facility and layout is not conducive to today's teaching & learning systems
- Building systems are well beyond useful life and need replacement

The current financial capacity of the City does not allow these important projects to move forward.

Mayor will be seeking input in the coming months on the feasibility, timing, cost and funding mechanisms for these projects.











FY2020 – FY2025 Repair Map (not including maintenance overlays FY22-25)



















