





#### **BACKGROUND:**

The property at 66 Winchester Street consists of 20,059 square feet improved with a two-story commercial building. The building is currently occupied by the Boston Showcase Company (BSC), a retail sales and warehouse since 1971, and a martial arts school in operation since 1996. The petitioner requests a special permit to allow for the 6,750 square feet occupied by Boston Showcase Company to be used for a for-profit fencing school.

The following review is based on plans and materials submitted to date as noted below.

- Zoning Review Application, prepared by Peter Harrington, attorney, dated 10/21/2019
- Class Schedule
- Floor Plan
- Site Plan, prepared by Mistry Associates, Inc, dated 9/23/2019



#### **ADMINISTRATIVE DETERMINATIONS:**

- 1. The property was acquired in 1971 by Boston Showcase Company, a food service and restaurant kitchen design, equipment and supplies dealer. The company uses a portion of the building for retail sales and warehouse storage. The petitioner proposes to introduce a forprofit fencing school into the 6,750 square feet of space currently used by Boston Showcase for product storage. Per sections 4.4.1 and 6.3.14.B.2, a special permit is required to allow a forprofit educational use in the Mixed Use 2 zoning district.
- 2. The building is currently occupied by the BSC and a martial arts studio. The martial arts studio has been on site since 1996. The retail and showroom portion of BSC will remain as is, as will the martial arts studio. The parking requirements for these uses remain the same.

BSC intends to replace 6,750 square feet of storage and warehouse with the proposed fencing school. Per section 5.1.4.A, a storage warehouse requires one parking stall per every 2,500 square feet, plus one stall per four employees. The 6,750 square foot space therefore requires three stalls for the square footage plus an additional stall for up to four employees, for a total of four stalls credited to the space. The petitioner's for-profit school use requires one stall for every employee at the largest shift. With four employees working at the school at the busiest shift, the credit of four stalls covers the proposed use and no waiver is necessary.
