Proposed plants by area for Reichenbach Prince St property:

Note: the design focus is on plants appropriate to or known to have been grown in the period when the house was constructed. Plants may be selected from these lists.

1) Evergreen and shrub border behind existing beech tree and along Prince Street

Conifers as: Cryptomeria japonica; Chamaecyparis selection; Picea selections;

Evergreen shrubs as: Ilex opaca; Rhododendrons –selected for an extended series of bloom; Pieris japonica

Deciduous shrubs as: Enkianthus campanulatus; Fothergilla major; Calycanthus floridus; Hydrangea paniculata selections

2) Vine arbor in corner :

Hydrangea paniculata in shade at rear with climbing roses, clematis and honeysuckle in sun.

3) Additional flowering shrubs along Prince Street including many classic plants grown in the early days of the Arnold Arboretum

Stewartia pseudocamellia; Kolkwitzia amabilis; Philadelphus; Deutzia; Spiraea; Symplocos; Magnolia; Niellia; with evergreen Ilex glabra; Ilex pedunculosa; Pinus parviflora; Chamaecyparis; Picea etc.

4) Sewall Street to driveway

Additional low shrub planting including Rhododendrons; Leucothoe; Cephalotaxus; Stephanandra; ground covers

5) Evergreen hedge by driveway and extending to rear of property:

Thuja plicata to be planted at 4-6' and trimmed as hedge; where planting area is too narrow to establish shrubs Parthenocissus tricuspidata (Boston Ivy) can be trained on horizontal slats or wires and kept clipped.

A low (42-45") fence is proposed along Prince and Sewall Street. This fence to be designed in concert with the architectural plans for the property. The fence to be integrated into the plantings and to serve as a 'child safe' barrier for the owners' grandchildren.
