In our Sept. 1 State Primary, 30,800 or 50% of the City's 61,354 registered voters cast ballots. (In the last State Primary in 2018 (which included the Governors' primaries), 15,942 people cast ballots.)

These results are preliminary and include all ballots cast, except those mail-in ballots that were put in the drop boxes at City Hall between 5:00 p.m. this evening and when polls closed at 8:00 p.m. Those ballots will be tallied tomorrow and will be added to the results.
