## **Current Cases**


There are 759 Newton residents who have tested positive for COVID-19, according to preliminary data through Thursday, June 4. This is a decrease of 1 case since yesterday due to a duplicate case that has now been resolved. I'm encouraged that the number of new cases considerably slowed. I am hoping this continues as we re-open.

## Apply for Emergency Housing Assistance

The deadline to be included in the lottery for Emergency Housing Assistance has passed. But, residents can still apply to Newton's Emergency Housing Assistance Fund. We're still in the midst of the process and it looks like approximately \$1.75 million of the \$2.5 million in funding may be allocated next week so we think that some funds will still be available.

New applications will be added to the wait list and will be processed if we're right that funds will still be available once all eligible households already on the lottery generated wait list are awarded assistance.

Newton residents who are experiencing a reduced income as a direct result of COVID-19 and earn 80% or less of the Area Median Income (AMI) at the time their application is submitted are encouraged to apply. Income-eligible Newton households may receive up to three months of rental or mortgage assistance (mortgage assistance only available to owners of affordable deed-restricted units). The assistance has a monthly cap of \$2,500 per household, or \$7,500 per household, for three months.
