The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. with Jim Gross presiding as Chair. Voting permanent members were N. Grissom, J. Martin, and D. Morton. Alternate T. Lucas was appointed to vote as a full member. B. Kurze acted as recording secretary and the meeting was digitally recorded on Zoom.

209 Walnut Street – Certificate of Appropriateness

Adam Lewis and Sharon Lewis presented an application to remove all the existing fencing and gates; the existing fencing was a mix of shadowbox, post and rail with wire mesh, open picket, and scalloped closed board designs. The new scalloped closed board cedar fencing would be six feet high in most locations with some four-foot-high sections close to the sidewalks on Walnut and Foster Streets. Wooden gates would be installed on the left and right side of the house.

Commission members agreed that the proposed fencing and fence plan was appropriate. N. Grissom moved to grant a Certificate of Appropriateness for the application as submitted. J. Martin seconded the motion. The motion passed, 5-0.

47 Prescott Street – Working Session

Julie Clinger requested feedback on a proposal to expand and change the left-side connector and garage to create additional living space, to change the front entry, and to add new dormers to the main house.

Materials Reviewed: Assessors database map Site plan Plans Elevations Photographs

Commission members agreed that the design was appropriate. J. Martin said the design was balanced and consistent with the language of the house; the design unified the house. D. Morton said the design improved the character of the house; he recommended putting clapboard on the entire house and using a trim band between the existing and new siding. He also recommended removing the shutters. N. Grissom said the owner should pick one of the original window configurations for the new design to be consistent; six-over-six or eight-over-eight, etc. Windows needed to be double-hung simulated divided lites with interior and exterior grilles. T. Lucas confirmed that the garage chimney that would be removed was not functional.

Administrative Discussion

<u>Commission Elections</u>: Commission members agreed to keep the current officers for the next term. D. Morton moved to re-elect Jim Gross as Chair, Nancy Grissom as Vice Chair, and Barbara Wales as Secretary. J. Martin seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously, 5-0.
