To All the Newton Councilors;

I am writing to urge you to vote to keep the current zoning as it is. Why?

If the zoning changes this will set precedent for all of Washington Street and other Newton villages to keep pushing the envelope and developers will eventually ask for higher and higher bigger more dense construction. Just look at Watertown and Waltham. Do we want to be another Boston?
