I would like to voice my objection to the issuance of a special permit for the proposed development at the corner of Walnut and Washington streets.

The notion of more affordable housing for the city and promoting a more vital business community in Newtonville is a good one. Adding stories so that the proposed structure looms over the intersection will add nothing to the neighborhood but plenty to the developer's bottom line.
