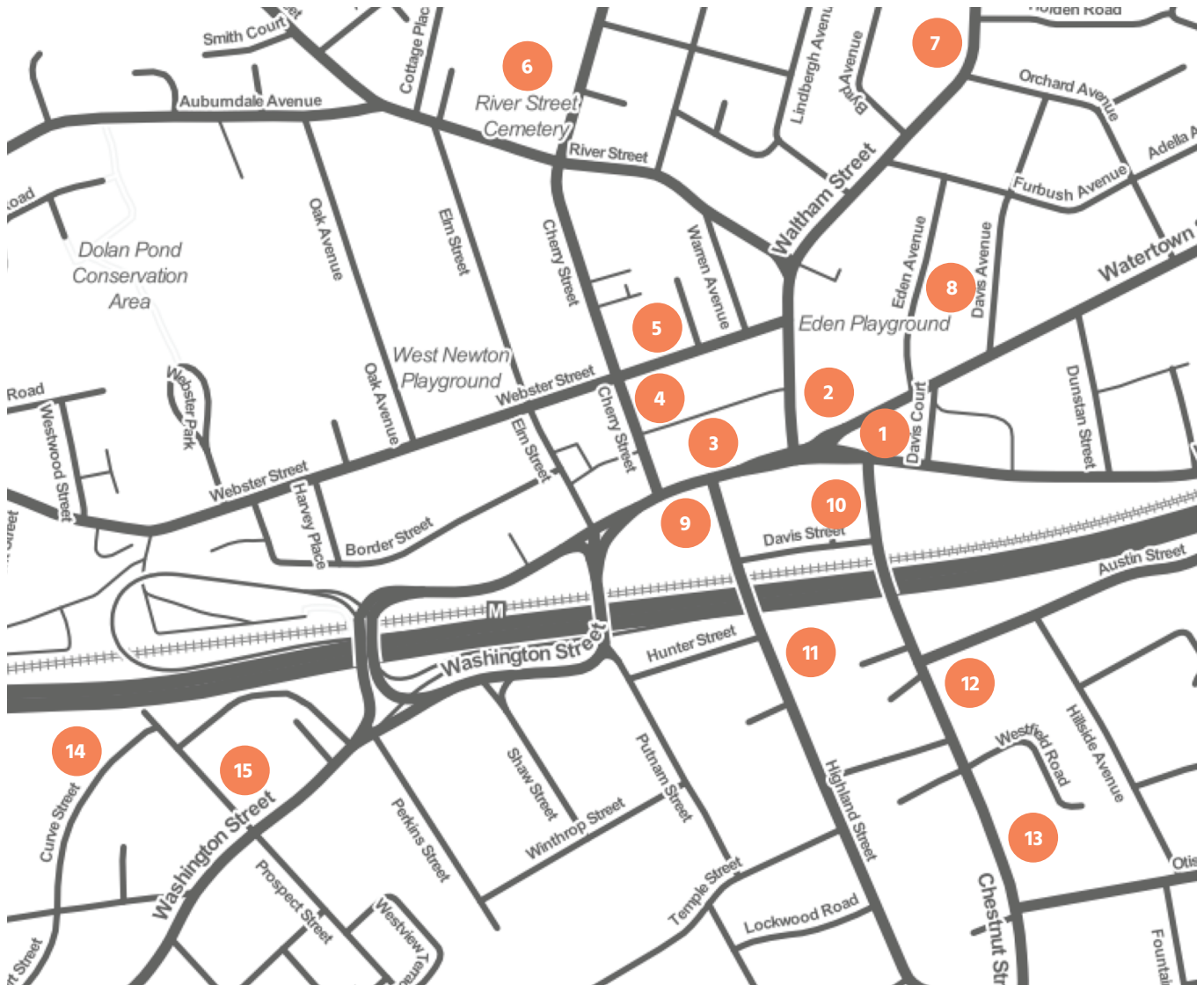


# WEST NEWTON
