CPC Recommendation to appropriate \$1,433,000 in CPA funding for Grace Church

<u>COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE</u> recommending the appropriation of one million four hundred and thirty-three thousand dollars (\$1,433,000) in Community Preservation Act historic resource funding to the Grace Episcopal Church Tower Restoration project for the stabilization and preservation of the historically significant ca. 1872 conical stone spire, tower and belfry.

Clerk's Note: Councilor Grossman presented an update to the request for CPA funds for the restoration of the Grace Church tower (#458-20). She noted that the Zoning and Planning and Finance Committees met jointly to discuss the request on January 11 and February 4, 2021. The Committees approved the request for funding, with different appropriation amounts. At the Council meeting on February 16, 2021, the Council voted to reconcile the reports and send the item back to the CPC to amend their recommendation to include a preservation restriction on the project. The CPC met on February 25, 2021 to review their recommendation. At the conclusion of their meeting, the recommendation for the funds was amended to include the following:

1. A new preservation restriction to be held by the City for the exterior of the building and;

2. How the funding will be released for the project and requires that the applicant place a matching amount of each CPC dollar.

Councilors noted that state stature governs how the preservation restrictions are drafted. Additionally, Councilors noted that if a future party wants to lift the preservation restriction, they will have to be granted permission from the City. Councilors deliberated the request. Councilors cited the tower's historic significance, the architectural presence in Newton Corner, the church's commitment to bell concerts and training and the connection to the residents. It was noted that the CPA funds can be used for the preservation of significant, historic architecture and the future use of the church space could change.

The Council expressed some concern relative to approval of the funds, noting that granting funds for one religious project will represent a significant policy change in the use of CPA funding. Additionally, it was suggested that many other religious entities may express interest in funding requests upon approval. It was noted that the proposed request represents 3.5 years of the CPA surcharge and other municipalities have funded church projects at an amount not exceeding \$435,000. Councilors reiterated concern relative to the use of municipal funds for religious uses and how there has been no analysis to determine how the structure can be preserved with less funding.

The Council voted 17 in favor 5 opposed (Councilors Crossley, Humphrey, Noel, Ryan and Albright).
