City of Newton Emergency Mortgage & Utility Assistance

In response to the continuing negative economic impacts caused by the coronavirus (COVID-19), the City of Newton is announcing a new COVID-19 Emergency Housing & Utility Relief Program utilizing its federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds.

Applicants are eligible for:

- ➤ Up to **two months of mortgage assistance**, with possible extensions
 - The program will cover <u>70% of a household's monthly mortgage payment</u>, with a maximum monthly assistance amount of \$2,500 per household
- ➤ Up to \$700 of utility assistance, with proof of overdue notice from utility company (heat, hot water, or electricity)

Eligible Households:

- Currently live in the City of Newton,
- Households must reside in an ownership unit that is deed-restricted affordable (restriction recorded with Registry of Deeds,
- Households must have had a negative economic impact because of COVID-19 (and can demonstrate this financial hardship), and
- Total Household income (at the time of application and/or recertification) cannot exceed the following limits:

 Households that were previously enrolled in the City's COVID-19 Emergency Housing Relief Program may be eligible to receive additional assistance, however, Metro West Collaborative Development will conduct a recertification process for *each of these* households prior to awarding the additional two months of funding and/or utility assistance
