* To promote the health and safety of City workers and the public, Newton City Hall is still observing COVID restrictions. The City has adopted the following procedures that may affect your participation in this bid:

- 2. Bids not sent by mail or courier to Room 108 may be dropped off in a locked drop box at the top of the stairs to left of the main door to City Hall. The box will be checked at the scheduled submission deadline.
- 3. Bids results will be scanned and posted as soon as practicable after the opening. Copies of bids will be available on written request.

Contract Documents will be available on or after 10:00 a.m., Thursday, October 7, 2021 on line at <u>www.newtonma.gov/bids</u> or for pickup at Newton City Hall, Room 108, Purchasing Department, 1000 Commonwealth Avenue, Newton Centre, MA 02459. There will be no charge for contract documents.

Award will be made to the lowest, responsible, and eligible bidder for services based on the Total Cost from Bid Form #22-22. Any bidder not providing prices for all line items may be deemed unresponsive and therefore rejected. **Provision of services is required to start upon the execution of this contract.**

The term of the awarded contract shall extend from the time of execution for approximately sixty (60) days or until the project completion.

Bids must be submitted with one (1) ORIGINAL and two (2) COPIES.

A bid deposit in an amount that is not less than five percent (5%) of the value of the bid, <u>including</u> all add alternates, is required. Bid deposits, payable to the City of Newton, shall be either in the form of a bid bond, or cash, or a certified check on, or a treasurer's or cashier's check issued by a responsible bank or trust company. The City of Newton will award the contract to the lowest eligible and responsible bidder. Please Note: this bid, in accordance with the Chapter 303 Acts of 2008, contains Price Adjustments and/or new Prevailing Wage requirements. All bidders are required to familiarize themselves with these terms and conditions before submitting a bid. Bidders are reminded that the bid deposit covers the City for damages when a bidder withdraws its bid after the bid submisssion date. **Be advised that to the extent permitted by the law the City will retain all bid deposits for withdrawn bids.**

All bids are subject to the provisions of M.G.L. c. 30, § 39M. **Wages are subject** to minimum wage rates determined by the Massachusetts Department of Labor and Industries pursuant to M.G.L. c. 149, § 26 to 27H. The schedule of wage rates applicable to this contract is included in the bidding documents. In addition, the prevailing wage schedule will be updated annually for all public construction projects lasting longer than one (1) year. You will be required to pay the rates set out in any updated prevailing wage schedule. Increases in prevailing wage schedules will not be the basis for change order requests. The successful bidder will be required to provide a Certificate of Insurance demonstrating current coverage of the type and amounts set forth in the Project Manual. The successful bidder will be required to furnish a **Labor and Materials Payment Bond in the amount of 50%** of the contract total. Wages are paid to drivers for all "**on-site**" work.

This project is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. As a result, Davis-Bacon and Related Acts requirements set forth in Concerning Labor Standards and Prevailing Wage Requirents (Federal Wage Rates – seperate file attached) will apply to this project and to the awarded bidder. Federal Wage Rates and State Wage Rates (set forth at pp. 39-69 below) are included in the bidding documents, **and the higher of the two will apply when calculating minimum rates for tradespersons.**

The costs of any bond and any insurance required in this Invitation For Bid are the responsibility of the bidder; such costs will not be reimbursed by City and should be included in your bid.

ARTICLE 1 - BIDDER'S REPRESENTATION

- 1.1 Each General Bidder (hereinafter called the "Bidder") by making a bid (hereinafter called "bid") represents that:
 - 1. The Bidder has read and understands the Bidding Documents, Contract Forms, General Conditions, Conditions of the Contract, General Requirements and Project Specifications (collectively, referred to as the "Contract Documents") and the bid is made in accordance therewith.
 - 2. The Bidder is familiar with the work site and local conditions under which the work has to be performed.
- 1.2 Failure to so examine the Contract Documents or to become familiare with the work site and local conditions will not relieve any Bidder from any obligation under the bid as submitted.

ARTICLE 2 - REQUEST FOR INTERPRETATION

- 2.1 Bidders shall promptly notify the City of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or error which they may discover upon examination of the Contract Documents, the site, and local conditions.
- 2.2 Bidders requiring clarification or interpretation of the Contract Documents shall make a written request to the *Chief Procurement Officer*, at <u>purchasing@newtonma.gov</u> or via facsimile (617) 796-1227. The City will only answer such requests if received **by Friday, October 15, 2021 at 12:00 noon**. In the event that the bid opening date is changed, the deadline for informational requests may also change as provided in an addendum issued by the City.
- 2.3 Interpretation, correction, or change in the Contract Documents will be made by addendum which will become part of the Contract Documents. The City will not be held accountable for any oral communication.
- 2.4 Addenda will be emailed to every individual or firm on record as having taken a set of Contract Documents. Addenda will be emailed to every individual or firm on record as having taken a set of Contract Documents. Receipt of all addenda issued must be acknowledged in the Bid Form. YOUR FAILURE TO ACKNOWLEDGE ALL ADDENDA MAY RESULT IN YOUR BID BEING REJECTED AS NON-RESPONSIVE.

- 2.7 Bidders downloading information off the internet web site are solely responsible for obtaining any addenda prior to the bid opening. ARTICLE 3 - MBE PARTICIPATION

- 3.1 Notice is hereby given that the Mayor's Affirmative Action Plan for the City of Newton in effect at the time of this solicitation is applicable to all construction contracts in excess of \$10,000.00.
- 3.2 Notice is hereby given that the City of Newton Minority/Women Business Enterprise Plan and the Supplemental Equal Employment Opportunity Anti-Discrimination and Affirmative Action Program in effect at the time of this solicitation are applicable to all City contracts for goods and services in excess of \$50,000.00.
- 3.3 Copies of the Plans and Program referred to in Sections 3.1 and 3.2 are available at: www.newtonma.gov/purchasing.

ARTICLE 4 - PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 4.1 Bids shall be submitted on the "Bid Form #22-22," at pp. 8-9 below.
- 4.2 All entries on the Bid Form shall be made by typewriter or in ink.
- 4.3 Where so indicated on the Bid Form, sums shall be expressed in both words and figures. Where there is a discrepancy between the bid sum expressed in words and the bid sum expressed in figures, the words shall control.
- 4.4 The Bid shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope with the following plainly marked on the outside:

- 4.5 Date and time for receipt of bids is set forth in the IFB.
- 4.6 Timely delivery of a bid at the location designated shall be the full responsibility of the Bidder. In the event that Newton City Hall is closed on the date or at the time that bids are due, the date and time for receipt of bids shall be on the next business day following that the Newton City Hall is open.
- 4.7 Bids shall be submitted with one (1) **original** and two (2) **copies.**
- 4.8 Be advised that a new Massachusetts law has been enacted that required all employees who work on Massachusetts public works construction sites must have no less than 10 hours of OSHA-approved safety and health training. See M.G.L. C. 30, §39R and M.G.L. C. 149, §44E.
 - 1. This requirement will apply to any general bid or sub bid submitted.
 - 2. This law directs the Massachusetts Attorney General to restrain the award of construction contracts to any Vendor who is in violation to this requirement and to restrain the performance of these contracts by non-complying Vendors.
 - 3. The Vendor and all subVendors on this project will be required to provide certification of compliance with this requirement. Non-compliance with this law will disquality you from bidding on public contracts.

ARTICLE 5 - ALTERNATES

- 5.1 Each Bidder shall acknowledge alternates (if any) in Section C on the Bid Form.
- 5.2 In the event an alternate does not involve a change in the amount of the base bid, the Bidder shall so indicated by writing "No Change", or "N/C" or "0" in the space provided for that alternate.
- 5.3 Bidders shall enter on the Bid Form a single amount for each alternate which shall consist of supplies to be provided by the Vendor.
- 5.4 The low Bidder will be determined on the basis of the sum of the base bid and the accepted alternates.

ARTICLE 6 - WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

- 6.1 Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the time designated for receipt of bids on written or electronic request. Electronic withdrawal of bids must be confirmed over the Bidder's signature by written notice postmarked on or before the date and time set for receipt of bids.
- 6.2 Withdrawn bids may be resubmitted up to the time designated for the receipt of bids.
- 6.3 No bids may be withdrawn after the opening of the bids.

ARTICLE 7 - CONTRACT AWARD

- 7.1 One (1) contract will be awarded to the will select the eligible and responsible Bidder providing the lowest bid all labor and materials for the trail rehab work. The City will award a contract within sixty (60) days (Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded) after the opening of bids. The City reserves the right to waive minor informalities in or to reject any or all Bids if it be in the public interest to do so.
- 7.2 The City reserves the right to reject any bidder who has failed to pay any local taxes, fees, assessments, betterments, or any other municipal charge, unless the bidder has a pending abatement application or has entered into a payment agreement with the collector-treasurer.
- 7.3 As used herein, the term "lowest responsible and eligible Bidder" shall mean the Bidder (1) whose bid is the lowest of those bidders possessing the skill, ability and integrity necessary for the faithful performance of the work; (2) who has met all the requirements of the invitation for bids; (3) who shall certify that he is able to furnish labor that can work in harmony with all other elements of labor employed or to be employed in the work; (4) who, where the provisions of section eight B of chapter twenty-nine apply, shall have been determined to be qualified thereunder.
- 7.4 Subsequent to the award and within five (5) days, Saturday, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after the prescribed forms are presented for signature, the successful Bidder shall execute and deliver to the City a contract in the form included in the Contract Documents in such number of counterparts as the City may require.
- 7.5 In the event that the City receives low bids in identical amount from two or more responsive and responsible Bidders, the City shall select the successful Bidder by a blind selection process such as flipping a coin or drawing names from a hat. The low Bidders who are under consideration will be invited to attend and observe the selection process.

ARTICLE 8 - TAXES

- 8.1 The Bidder shall not include in this bid any tax imposed upon the sale or rental of tangible personal property in this Commonwealth, such as any and all building materials, supplies, services and equipment required to complete the work.
- 8.2 The City is exempt from payment of the Massachusetts Sales Tax, and the Bidder shall not include any sales tax on its bid. The City's exemption Number is E-046-001-404.

ARTICLE 9 - PROPRIETARY SPECIFICATIONS

9.1 The City may have used a proprietary specification to describe the supply listed in the specifications. Such specifications are permitted under M.G.L. c. 30, §39M(b), provided that the City states in writing that use of the proprietary specification is in its best interest and that it will accept an "equal" of the item specified. An item is considered equal if (i) it is at least equal in quality, durability, appearance, strength, and design; (ii) will perform the intended function at least equally; and (iii) conforms substantially, even with deviations, to the detailed requirements contained in the specifications. in the event that the Bidder wishes to substitute an equal item, it may do so either in its bid or proposal or after the contract is awarded but before a contract is executed, it being understood that the award shall be conditioned on the Bidder providing the item originally specified or an equal item accepted by the City and identified in the contract. In no event shall the Bidder be entitled to offer, or the City obliged to consider, the substitution of an item as equal after execution of a contract.

In the event the Bidder substitutes or attempts to substitute an "equal" item after that date, it shall be in breach thereof and be liable for actual and consequential damages resulting from its failure to perform as agreed. The City shall have the sole right to determine whether or not said item is equal.

9.2 The required determination and justification have been duly prepared, and a copy may be requested in accordance with the Massachusetts Public Records Law, M.G.L. c. 66, §10.



- 2. Interpretation, correction, or change in the Contract Documents will be made by Addendum which will become part of the Contract Documents. The City will not be held accountable for any oral representation that is inconsistent with the terms of the Contract Documents.
- 3. Addenda will be emailed to every individual or firm on record as having downloaded a set of Contract Documents. Addenda will also be posted on the City's website at: <u>www.newtonma.gov/bids</u>. Any bidder downloading the IFB and any plans for a City bid shall email their company's information along with the IFB Number and Project Title that they downloaded. You will then be added to the bidder's list and email distribution list.
- 4. Prices quoted must include inside delivery to the destination specified on the Purchase Order.
- 5. No charges will be allowed for packing, crating, freight, Express or cartage unless specifically stated and included in the bid.
- 6. The award to the successful bidder may be cancelled if successful bidder shall fail to prosecute the work with promptness and diligence.
- 7. Time in connection with discount offered will be computed from the date of delivery, as specified on purchase order, or from date correct invoice is received, if the latter date is later than the date of delivery.

EXECUTION

HAULING, HANDLING AND STORAGE OF MATERIALS:

The Contractor shall, at their own expense, handle and haul all materials furnished by them and shall remove any of their surplus materials at the completion of the work.

The Contractor shall provide suitable and adequate storage for equipment and materials furnished by them that are liable to injury and shall be responsible for any loss of or damage to any equipment or materials by theft, breakage, or otherwise.

All excavated materials and equipment to be incorporated in the Work shall be placed so as not to injure any part of the Work or existing facilities and so that free access can be had at all times to all parts of the Work. Materials and equipment shall be kept neatly piled and compactly stored in such location as will cause minimum inconvenience to public travel and adjoining owners, tenants and occupants.

The Contractor shall be responsible for all damages to the work under construction during its progress and until final completion and acceptance even though partial payments have been made under the Contract.

OPEN EXCAVATIONS:

All open excavations shall be adequately safeguarded by providing temporary barricades, caution signs, lights and other means to prevent accidents to persons, and damage to property. The Contractor shall, at their own expense, provide suitable and safe means for completely covering all open excavations if applicable.

MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC:

Construction traffic and operations shall be conducted so that vehicular and pedestrian traffic may be safely maintained at all times.

Should the Chief of Police deem it necessary, uniformed officers will be assigned to direct traffic. The Contractor shall make all arrangements in obtaining uniformed officers required.

The Contractor shall furnish all construction signs that are deemed necessary by and in accordance with Part VI of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices as published by the U.S. Department of Transportation. In addition, the Contractor may be required to furnish up to 128 square feet of additional special construction warning signs. Size and exact wording of signs shall be determined by the Owner during construction.

The intent of policing is to ensure public safety by direction of traffic. Police officers are not to serve as watchmen to protect the Contractor's equipment and materials.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed as relieving the Contractor of any of their responsibilities for protection of persons and property under the terms of the Contract.

CARE AND PROTECTION OF PROPERTY:

The Contractor shall be responsible for the preservation of all public and private property, and shall use every precaution necessary to prevent damage thereto. If any direct or indirect damage is done to public or private property by or on account of any act, omission, neglect, or misconduct in the execution of the work on the part of the Contractor, such property shall be promptly restored by the Contractor, at their expense, to a condition similar or equal to that existing before the damage was done, to the satisfaction of the Owner.

MAINTENANCE OF FLOW:

All existing drainage facilities including, but not limited to; brooks, streams, canals, channels, ditches, culverts, catch basins and drainage piping shall be adequately safeguarded so as not to impede drainage or to cause siltation of downstream areas in any manner whatsoever. If the Contractor damages or impairs any of the aforesaid drainage facilities, they shall repair the same within the same day.

At the conclusion of the work and following approval by the Owner's representative, the Contractor shall remove all Erosion and Sedimentation controls as well as trapped sediments as described in Section 01740, CLEANING UP.

REJECTED MATERIALS AND DEFECTIVE WORK:

Materials furnished by the Contractor and condemned by the Owner as unsuitable or not in conformity with the specifications shall forthwith be removed from the work by the Contractor and shall not be made use of elsewhere in the work.

Any errors, defects or omissions in the execution of the work or in the materials furnished by the Contractor, even though they may have been passed or overlooked or have appeared after the completion of the work, discovered at any time before the final payment is made hereunder, shall be forthwith rectified and made good by and at the expense of the Contractor and in a manner satisfactory to the Owner.

The Contractor shall reimburse the Owner for any expense, losses or damages incurred in consequence of any defect, error, omission or act of the Contractor or their employees, as determined by the Owner, occurring prior to the final payment.

Any employees found violating these provisions shall be discharged and not again employed on the work without the written consent of the Owner. The sanitary conveniences specified above shall be the obligation and responsibility of the Contractor.

SAFETY AND HEALTH REGULATIONS:

This project is subject to the Safety and Health regulations of the U.S. Department of Labor set forth in 29 CFR, Part 1926, and to the Massachusetts Department of Labor and Industries, Division of Industrial Safety "Rules and Regulations for the Prevention of Accidents in Construction Operations (454 CMR 10.0 et. seq.)." Contractors shall be familiar with the requirements of these regulations.

SITE INVESTIGATION:

The Contractor acknowledges that they have satisfied themselves as to the conditions existing at the site of the work, the type of equipment required to perform this work, the quality and quantity of the materials furnished insofar as this information is reasonably ascertainable from an inspection of the site, as well as from information presented by the drawings and specifications made a part of this contract. Any failure of the Contractor to acquaint themselves with available information will not relieve them from the responsibility for estimating properly the difficulty or cost of successfully performing the work. The Owner assumes no responsibility for any conclusion or interpretation made by the Contractor based on the information made available by the Owner.

SECTION 01330 - SUBMITTALS

PART - 1 GENERAL

WORK INCLUDED:

The contractor shall provide the Owner with Submittals as required by the contract documents.

RELATED WORK:

All specifications that require submittals.

PART - 2 MATERIALS

N/A

PART - 3 EXECUTION

GENERAL:

The Contractor shall submit a schedule of material sample submittals as required.

SAMPLES:

Samples specified in individual Sections include, but are not necessarily limited to, physical examples of the work such as sections of manufactured or fabricated work, small cuts or containers of materials, complete units of repetitively used products, color/texture/pattern swatches and range sets, specimens for coordination of visual effect, graphic symbols, and units of work to be used by the Owner for independent inspection and testing, as applicable to the work.

The number of samples submitted shall be as specified. Submittal and processing of samples shall follow the procedures outlined for shop drawings unless the specifications call for a field submittal or mock-up.

Acceptance of samples will be acknowledged via email noting status. When samples are not acceptable, prompt resubmittal will be required.

DESCRIPTION:

This section of the specification covers the control of dust via water. No calcium chloride shall be used for dust control for this project.

WORK INCLUDED

Under this Section, the Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, equipment and transportation required to complete Dust Control as designated by the Owner, or as specified herein, to complete all proposed work.

PART - 2 PRODUCTS:

WATER:

Water shall not be brackish and shall be free from oil, acid, and injurious alkali or vegetable matter.

PART - 3 EXECUTION

APPLICATION:

Water may be sprinkler applied with equipment including a tank with gauge-equipped pressure pump and a nozzle-equipped spray bar if directed by the Owner.

Water shall be dispersed through the nozzle under a minimum pressure of 20 pounds per square inch, gauge pressure.

SECTION 01570 - ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

GENERAL

DESCRIPTION:

The work covered by this section of the specifications consists of furnishing all labor, materials, tools and equipment and performing all work required for the prevention of environmental pollution during and as a result of construction operations under this contract.

Prior to commencement of work, the Contractor shall meet with representatives of the Owner to develop mutual understandings relative to compliance of the environmental protection program.

RELATED WORK:

Section 01562, DUST CONTROL

SUBMITTALS:

The Contractor shall submit for approval six sets of details and literature fully describing environmental protection methods to be employed in carrying out construction activities.

PART - 1 PRODUCTS:

STRAW WATTLES:

Straw Wattles shall consist of a 100% biodegradable exterior jute or coir netting with 100% wheat straw interior filling or approved equal.

The wattles will be placed and staked in the ground using wooden stakes. The wooden stakes will be placed at a minimum depth of 24-inches into the ground.

TREE PROTECTION:

The Contractor shall protect all existing trees, shrubs, lawns and other site features designated to remain. The placement of protection devices, such as snow fence enclosures, shall, however, be at the Contractor's discretion with written approval from the Owner. Contractor shall consult with the Owner to determine adequate tree protection methods, including but not limited to, fencing, root cutting, and mulch or plywood sheeting to protect root systems from compaction.

PART - 2 EXECUTION

NOTIFICATION AND STOPPAGE OF WORK:

The Owner will notify the Contractor in writing of any non-compliance with the provisions of the Order of Conditions. The Contractor shall, after receipt of such notice, immediately take corrective action. Such notice, when delivered to the Contractor or his authorized representative at the site of the work, shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose. If the Contractor fails to act promptly, the Owner may order stoppage of all or part of the work until satisfactory corrective action has been taken. No claim for an extension of time or for excess costs or damage incurred by the Contractor as a result of time lost due to any stop work orders shall be made unless it was later determined that the Contractor was in compliance.

AREA OF CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY:

Insofar as possible, the Contractor shall confine their construction activities to those areas defined by the plans and specifications. All land resources within the project boundaries and outside the limits of permanent work performed under this contract shall be preserved in their present condition or be restored to a condition after completion of construction at least equal to that which existed prior to work under this contract.

PROTECTION OF WATER RESOURCES:

The Contractor shall not pollute the underground, perennial stream running under the property through a culvert with fuels, oils, bitumens, calcium chloride, acids or other harmful materials. It is the Contractor's responsibility to comply with all applicable Federal, State, County and Municipal laws regarding pollution of rivers and streams.

Special measures should be taken to insure against spillage of any pollutants into public waters, including onsite inputs to the culvert.

PROTECTING AND MINIMIZING EXPOSED AREAS:

The Contractor shall limit the area of land which is exposed and free from vegetation during construction. In areas where the period of exposure will be greater than two (2) months, temporary vegetation, mulching or other protective measures shall be provided as specified.

LOCATION OF STORAGE AREAS:

The location of the Contractor's storage areas for equipment and/or materials shall be upon cleared portions of the job site or areas to be cleared as a part of this project and shall require written approval of the Owner.

No excavated materials or materials used in backfill operations shall be deposited within a minimum distance of one hundred (100) feet of any drainage infrastructure to the culvert. Adequate measures for erosion and sediment control such as the placement of straw wattles around the downstream perimeter of stockpiles shall be employed to protect any downstream culvert input from siltation.

The Owner may designate a particular area or areas where the Contractor may store materials used in their operations.

PROTECTION OF LANDSCAPE:

The Contractor shall not deface, injure, or destroy trees or shrubs nor remove or cut them without written authority from the Owner. No ropes, cables, or guys shall be fastened to or attached to any existing nearby trees for anchorages unless specifically authorized by the Owner. Excavating machinery shall be of suitable type and be operated with care to prevent injury to trees which are not to be removed, particularly overhanging branches and limbs. The Contractor shall, in any event, be responsible for any damage resulting from such use.

Branches, limbs, and roots shall not be cut except by permission of the Owner. All cutting shall be smoothly and neatly done without splitting or crushing. When there is unavoidable injury to branches, limbs and trunks of trees, the injured portions shall be neatly trimmed and covered with an application of grafting wax or tree healing paint as directed.

Where, in the opinion of the Owner, trees may possibly be defaced, bruised, injured, or otherwise damaged by the Contractor's equipment or other operations, the Owner may require the Contractor to adequately protect such trees by placing boards, planks, poles or fencing around them. Any trees or landscape feature scarred or damaged by the Contractor's equipment or operations shall be restored as nearly as possible to its original condition at the expense of the Contractor.

TREE PROTECTION:

The Contractor shall provide tree protection as shown on the plans and shall be provided only on the Owner's land or the Owner's easements, and only the area required for construction operations, as approved by the Owner.

DUST CONTROL:

During the progress of the work, the Contractor shall conduct their operations and maintain the area of their activities, including sweeping and sprinkling as necessary, to minimize creation and dispersion of dust.

STRAW WATTLES:

The wattles will be placed and staked in the ground using wooden stakes. The wooden stakes will be placed at a minimum depth of 24-inches into the ground.

PART - 3 MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

<u>STRAW WATTLE</u> is to be measured and paid by LINEAR FOOT and shall include all labor, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work as specified.

<u>TREE PROTECTION</u> is to be measured and paid by <u>LINEAR FOOT</u> and shall include all labor, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work as specified.

END OF SECTION

SECTION 01720 - CONSTRUCTION LAYOUT

PART - 1 GENERAL

SCOPE OF WORK:

The work under this section shall consist of field staking the horizontal alignment of all essential features and proposed work, and other related features as shown on the plans.

PART - 2 MATERIALS

LAYOUT AND STAKING:

The Contractor shall be responsible for furnishing all stakes, pins, and markings as required to implement the work of layout and staking and shall make all field adjustments ordered by the Owner at no extra cost.

PART - 3 EXECUTION

LAYOUT:

The Contractor shall be responsible for scheduling an on-site meeting with the Owner's Representative preliminary field verification of essential features and proposed work, and other related features as shown on the plans.

The Contractor shall inform the Owner's Representative when the general layout is completed and shall not begin work until the various alignments have been approved by the Owner. Any discrepancies encountered in field conditions shall be reported immediately and shall be adjusted as directed.

The Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining the correct horizontal alignment of all elements, which responsibility shall not be waived by the Owner's approval of basic layout and stakeout.

SECTION 01740 - CLEANING UP

PART - 1 GENERAL

DESCRIPTION:

The Contractor must always employ during the progress of their work adequate cleanup measures and safety precautions to prevent injuries to persons or damage to property. The Contractor shall immediately provide adequate material, equipment and labor to cleanup and make safe any and all areas deemed necessary by the Owner.

PART - 2 PRODUCTS

PART - 3 EXECUTION

DAILY CLEANUP:

The Contractor shall clean up, at least daily, all refuse, rubbish, scrap and surplus material, debris and unneeded construction equipment resulting from the construction operations and sweep the area. The site of the work and the adjacent areas affected thereby shall at all times present a neat, orderly and professional appearance.

Upon written notification by the Owner, the Contractor shall within 24 hours clean up those areas, which in the Owner's opinion are in violation of this section and the above referenced sections of the specifications.

If in the opinion of the Owner, the referenced areas are not satisfactorily cleaned up, all other work on the project shall stop until the cleanup is satisfactory.

MATERIAL OR DEBRIS IN DRAINAGE FACILITIES:

Where material or debris has washed or flowed into or has been placed in existing watercourses, ditches, gutters, drains, pipes, structures, such material or debris shall be entirely removed and satisfactorily disposed of during progress of the work. Such ditches, channels, drains, pipes, structures, and work shall, upon completion of the work, be left in a clean and neat condition.

REMOVAL OF TEMPORARY STRUCTURE AND EQUIPMENT:

On or before completion of the work, the Contractor shall, unless otherwise specifically directed or permitted in writing, tear down and remove all temporary structures built by them; shall remove all temporary work, tools and machinery or other construction equipment furnished by them; shall remove all rubbish from any grounds which they have occupied; shall remove erosion controls used for trapping sediment; and shall leave all parts of the property and adjacent property affected by their operations in a neat and satisfactory condition.

RESTORATION OF DAMAGED PROPERTY:

The Contractor shall restore or replace, when and as directed, any property damaged by their work, equipment or employees, to a condition at least equal to that existing immediately prior to the beginning of operations. To this end the Contractor shall do, as required, all necessary work. Materials, equipment, and methods for such restoration shall be as approved by the Owner.

FINAL CLEANUP:

Before acceptance by the Owner, the Contractor shall perform a final cleanup to bring the construction site to its original or specified condition. This cleanup shall include removing all trash and debris off the premises. Before acceptance, the Owner shall approve the condition of the site.

END OF SECTION

SECTION 02300 - EARTHWORK

PART - 1 GENERAL

WORK INCLUDED:

Under this Section, the Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, equipment and transportation required to complete Earthwork as indicated on the drawings, as designated by the Owner, or as specified herein, to complete all proposed work.

The Contractor or Sub-contractor must have a minimum of five (5) years of experience installing trails of similar size and quality as this project.

Work under this Section shall include the furnishing of all materials required to complete the proposed work as designed. Where "processed gravel", or "gravel" is indicated in the specifications or on the drawings, only gravel and other stone conforming to this section of the specifications may be utilized.

The work to be done under this Section shall be the furnishing, placement and compaction of compacted stone dust trail surface as shown on the drawings and as specified herein.

RELATED WORK:

Section 01110, CONTROL OF WORK AND MATERIALS

Section 01570, ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

SUBMITTALS:

Prior to ordering and delivering materials to the site, (1) representative samples of accessible trail surfacing shall be sent to the Engineer for approval. The material shall be analyzed by a certified testing laboratory and certified by the supplier as a byproduct of a stone quarry operation.

The color shall be medium to dark gray when wet and consistent throughout. Samples must match that product which is to be installed.

PART - 2 PRODUCTS

MATERIALS

EXCAVATION

All excavation within the limit of work shall be performed as required by the Owner. Removal of existing pavement such as existing trail material or bituminous concrete in these zones shall be by hand tools and/or air spade to ensure root health for existing trees.

STONE DUST TRAIL SURFACE WITH STABILIZER:

Stone dust shall be the product of a stone crusher and shall consist of inert materials that are hard, durable stone, free from surface coatings and deleterious materials.

Gradation requirements shall be as follows:

Compacted stone dust surfacing shall be 'Crushed Schist' as manufactured by John S. Lane & Son, Inc. West Stockbridge Quarry, MA or approved equal.

- 1) Non-toxic, non-staining water-activated soil stabilizer.
- 2) "Organic-Lock" by Envirobond Products Corporation, 6191-2100 Bloor Street West, Toronto, Ontario, Canada M6S 5A5, (866)-636-8476, or approved equal.

3/4" GRAVEL:

Gravel shall be the product of a 3/4" minus crushed rock derived from hard rock processed in a quarry and shall consist of inert materials that are hard, durable stone, free from surface coatings and deleterious materials.

The approved source of gravel material shall be processed by mechanical means. The equipment for producing crushed gravel shall be of adequate size with sufficient adjustments to produce the desired materials. All processed gravel shall come from approved stockpiles.

RIVERSTONE:

Riverstone located within the flood storage area shall be a mix of 1-inch, 3-inch, and 5- inch diameter sizes. The riverstone shall be smooth and have rounded edges. The stone shall be placed in a randomized pattern to mimic naturalistic placement. River stone color and general form selection shall be submitted to the Owner's Representative for review and approval.

The Contractor shall notify the Owner's Representative when site preparation is complete. The Contractor shall lay the riverstone and make adjustments in the arrangement of the stone as required by the Owner's Representative. The Owner's Representative shall approve the final layout of the stone.

PLACING AND COMPACTING:

STONE DUST TRAIL SURFACE

The trail surfacing with stabilizer shall be placed over a previously approved and/or installed compacted subgrade as detailed and as specified under Section 02300 of these Specifications. Subgrade surfacing, as required, shall be smoothed, flattened, and compacted, with no loose stone or debris present in the trail tread.

The compacted trail surfacing shall be placed to the line shown on the plans and shall consist of a minimum of the detailed thickness. Stabilized trail surfacing shall be uniformly mixed at optimum moisture content, spread, and compacted in lifts. The maximum thickness of any one lift shall be 3".

Compaction shall continue until the surface is even and true to the proposed lines within a tolerance of threeeighths (3/8) inch above or below the required cross sectional material depths and to a maximum irregularity not exceeding three-eighths (3/8) inch under a ten (10) foot line longitudinally. Any specific area of material which, after being rolled, does not form a satisfactory, solid, stable surface shall be removed, replaced and recompacted by the Contractor without extra compensation.

Obtain compaction using one of the following methods:

By hand, using non-mechanized compaction tools over the full area of each layer until visual displacement ceases;

By mechanical vibratory compactors over the full area of each layer until visual displacement ceases, but not fewer than three complete passes.

SOIL STABILIZER BLENDING:

The soil stabilizer shall be carefully measured and shall be subsequently blended with the stonedust at the manufacturers recommended rate for three (3) inch compacted stabilized stonedust pathways.

COMPLETING STABILIZER INSTALLATION

Apply a light spray to the surface of the material to give a clean appearance. Apply water until the water begins to run-off. Do not allow any traffic on the newly installed pathway until fully cured, a minimum of 24 to 72 hours.

3/4" GRAVEL

The gravel shall be placed to the line shown on the plans and shall consist of a minimum of the detailed thickness. The maximum thickness of any one lift shall be 2".

Compaction shall continue until the surface is even and true to the proposed lines. Any specific area of material which, after being rolled, does not form a satisfactory, solid, stable surface shall be removed, replaced and recompacted by the Contractor without extra compensation.

Obtain compaction using one of the following methods:

By hand, using non-mechanized compaction tools over the full area of each layer until visual displacement ceases;

By mechanical vibratory compactors over the full area of each layer until visual displacement ceases, but not fewer than three complete passes.

RIVERSTONE

Riverstone shall be placed to a depth of three (3) inches in one operation and in such a manner as to avoid displacing the underlying material. Placing of riverstone in layers or by dumping into chutes or by other similar methods likely to cause segregation will not be permitted.

Riverstones shall be placed and distributed such that there will be no large accumulation of either the larger or smaller stones in any given area.

It is the intent of these specifications to produce compact riverstone shoulder in which all required sizes of stone are placed in the proper proportions. Hand placing or rearranging of individual stones by mechanical equipment shall be utilized to the extent necessary to secure the desired results.

PART - 3 MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

<u>EXCAVATION</u> is to be measured and paid by <u>CUBIC YARD</u> and shall include all labor, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work as specified.

<u>STONE DUST TRAIL SURFACE WITH STABILIZER</u> is to be measured and paid by <u>TON</u> and shall include all labor, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work as specified.

<u>3/4" GRAVEL</u> is to be measured and paid by <u>CUBIC YARD</u> and shall include all labor, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work as specified.

<u>**RIVERSTONE</u>** is to be measured and paid by <u>TON</u> and shall include all labor, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work as specified.</u>

WAGE RATE REQUIREMENTS

1. GENERAL

- A. This section summarizes the requirements for the payment of wages to laborers and mechanics employed under the Contract.
- **B**. Other duties and requirements of law which may not be specified in this section apply and are inherently a part of the Contract.

2. WAGE RATES

- A. The rate per hour to be paid to mechanics, apprentices, teamsters, chauffeurs, and laborers employed on the Work shall not be less than the rate of wages in the attached "Minimum Wage Rates" as determined by the Commissioner of Labor and Industries. This schedule shall continue to be the minimum rate of wages for said employees during the life of this Contract.
- **B.** Keep posted on the site a legible copy of said schedule. Keep on file the wage rates and classifications of labor employed on this Work in order that they may be available for inspection by the Owner, Administrator, or the Architect.
- C. Apprentices employed pursuant to this determination of wage rates must be registered and approved by the State Apprenticeship Council wherever rates for journeymen or apprentices are not listed.
- **D.** Pay reserve police officers employed on the Work the prevailing rate of wages paid to regular police officers as required by M.G.L. c149, Sec. 34B, as amended. Such police officers shall be covered by Workmen's Compensation Insurance and Employers Liability Insurance by the Contractor.
- E. The Contractor and all subcontractors shall, on a weekly basis throughout the term of the contract, provide to the City of Newton certified payroll affidavits in pdf format verifying compliance with M.G.L. c.149, Sec. 27, 27A and 27B. The Contractor is obiligated to provide such records to the City directly on a weekly basis. The City may assess a penalty of \$100 for each day beyond the required submission date that such records are received, which amount shall be deducted from any amounts to the Contractor from the City. In the event of chronic late submissions, the City shall report the same to the Office of the Attorney General.
- **F.** The Contractor and all subcontractors shall provide a Statement of Compliance within 15 days of the completion of its portion of the work. This statement shall be submitted to the Owner on the form found elsewhere in this section.
- G. The Contractor shall maintain accurate and complete records, including payroll records, during the Contract term and for three years thereafter.

• An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule from the Department of Labor Standards ("DLS") if it has not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK projects (bid pursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.

• The wage schedule shall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wage schedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wage schedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or any sub-contractor.

• All apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Massachusetts Department of Labor Standards, Division of Apprentice Standards (DLS/DAS). Apprentice must keep his/her apprentice identification card on his/her person during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wage schedule. Any apprentice not registered with DLS/DAS regardless of whether or not they are registered with any other federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the journeyworker's rate for the trade.

• The wage rates will remain in effect for the duration of the project, except in the case of multi-year public construction projects. For construction projects lasting longer than one year, awarding authorities must request an updated wage schedule. Awarding authorities are required to request these updates no later than two weeks before the anniversary of the date the contract was executed by the awarding authority and the general contractor. For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. Contractors are required to obtain the wage schedules from awarding authorities, and to pay no less than these rates to covered workers. The annual update requirement is not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts.

• Every contractor or subcontractor which performs construction work on the project is required to submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports to DLS. • Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wage schedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953.

• Employees not receiving the prevailing wage rate set forth on the wage schedule may report the violation to the Fair Labor Division of the office of the Attorney General at (617) 727-3465.

• Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing wage rates listed on the wage schedule to all employees who perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and criminal penalties.

A. PAID HOLIDAYS: New Year's Day, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Patriot's Day, Columbus Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day B. PAID VACATION: Employees with 4 months to 1 year of service receive 1/2 day's pay per month; 1 week vacation for 1 - 5 years of service; 2 weeks vacation for 5 - 10 years of service; and 3 weeks vacation for more than 10 years of service

WELDERS - Receive rate prescribed for craft performing operation to which welding is incidental.

Note: Executive Order (EO) 13706, Establishing Paid Sick Leave for Federal Contractors applies to all contracts subject to the Davis-Bacon Act for which the contract is awarded (and any solicitation was issued) on or after January 1, 2017. If this contract is covered by the EO, the contractor must provide employees with 1 hour of paid sick leave for every 30 hours they work, up to 56 hours of paid sick leave each year. Employees must be permitted to use paid sick leave for their own illness, injury or other health-related needs, including preventive care; to assist a family member (or person who is like family to the employee) who is ill, injured, or has other health-related needs, including preventive care; or for reasons resulting from, or to assist a family member (or person who is like family to the employee) who is a victim of, domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking. Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of ""identifiers"" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014. Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
