





Figure 43. Community Survey: Open Space Resources in Greatest Demand







Russ Halloran Sports & Recreation Complex at Albemarle


- Developed multi-phased, multi-year improvement plans

- Improved accessibility
- Replaced existing sports lighting at end-of-life
- Assessed park program and use needs, including:
 - Gath Pool footprint
 - school uses
 - cultural events
- Improved safe routes to schools
- Improved Stormwater Management
- Improved shade and tree canopy coverage where possible
- Improved athletic field amenities i.e dugouts, batting cages, scoreboards (with some private funding)
- Assessed feasibility of artificial turf

- Revisit and update 2008 Plan to account for current and newly identified community needs




Brown-Oak Hill Fields 11.3 ACRES

- Install high efficiency irrigation with remote access and weather clock
- Improve field drainage

Forte Park


- Improved lighting to high efficiency, low spillage fixtures and upgrade for remote access (retain existing poles) 15 Riverdale Developer mitigation funds

Village: West Newton

- 2 softball diamonds
- 59 Parking spaces (3 ADA)
- 6 tennis courts

- 1 Boys Lacrosse (with safety conflicts due to topography)
- 1 Intermediate rectangular fields per site allows



Richard J. McGrath Park

- New accessible perimeter path and seating
- Removed or reconfigured courts to increase multi purpose athletic field space (Myrtle St. Side only)
- Removed underutilized backstop and infield
- Expanded irrigation system to areas where ballfield has been removed
- Improved irrigation efficiency and remote access
- Properly located and designed lacrosse practice wall (Wall construction cost to be privately funded)
- Improved athletic equipment storage
- Improved field perimeter fence (and netting)
- Scoreboards
- Designated area for seasonal restrooms
- Caliper inch replacement for any trees removed
- Increased tree canopy where possible


Newton South HS Stadium 7 ACRES
