M E M O R A N D U M

On December 3, 2007, the Board of Aldermen approved as amended, docket item #421-05, which authorized changes to the structure of the Traffic Council. At that time, the Committee requested an annual update of Traffic Council Actions. The attached information is provided to the Committee as requested. *No action is necessary.*

During 2021, Traffic Council held eleven evening meetings (all virtual). As shown in Appendix A, during 2021 Traffic Council heard 102 items and took final action on all but ten of them. A list of all items heard during 2021 is shown in Appendix B, including the following ten items, which are still being held:

- TC5-21 COUNCILORS ALBRIGHT AND NORTON requesting to change the distribution of time limits in the Austin Street Public Parking Lot in Newtonville to install reserved spaces for EV Charging Stations and/or EV Shared Vehicles.
- TC6-21 COUNCILORS BOWMAN, DANBERG, AND NOEL requesting to change the distribution of time limits in the Hartford Street Public Parking Lot in Newton Highlands to install reserved spaces for EV Charging Stations and/or EV Shared Vehicles.
- TC149-20 DAVID KOSES, TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR, requesting to update the Traffic and Parking Regulations to reflect all of the changes associated with the reconstruction of Needham Street.

- TC21-21 JASON SOBEL, DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORATION OPERATIONS, requesting that Traffic Council hold this item for a long-term trial of the following to accommodate the reconstruction of the Library Parking Lot: Change the traffic flow on Homer Street between Commonwealth Avenue and Walnut Street to allow for a one-way circulation, change the parking locations and regulations along this section of Homer Street to include the creation of additional parking, and, if needed, allow for the creation of permit parking on nearby residential streets for City Hall and Library employees as well as other related needs. After construction is completed, conditions will revert back unless subsequent items are docketed and approved by Traffic Council for permanent changes
- TC34-21 COUNCILORS BOWMAN, DANBERG, AND NOEL, requesting to change the parking regulations on a portion of Station Avenue to allow for the installation of an in-street Bluebikes Station.
- TC48-21 DAVID KOSES, TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR, requesting to modify Sec. TPR-194. Time limits in municipal off-street parking areas, and possibly to modify Sec. TPR-176. Parking regulations pertaining to particular streets, in order to move forward with a long-term trial of a parking permit plan for Newton Centre employees
- TC57-21 DAVID KOSES, TRAFFIC COUNCIL CHAIR, requesting to continue an ongoing trial of the closure of Philip Bram Way at the intersection of Austin Street. Note that this item makes no change in the field and allows for a continuation of a trial first approved as part of TC50-18.
- TC71-21 COUNCILORS GREENBERG, LEARY, AND OLIVER requesting to restrict
 parking on the north side of Clinton Street, to ensure safe access for emergency,
 trash and recycling vehicles. This may include removing or relocating accessible
 parking on the street.
- TC79-21 ISAAC PRIZANT, CITY TRANSPORTATION ENGINEER, requesting to trial a
 parking restriction on the east side of Centre Street, beginning at Allerton Road
 heading 50 feet southerly, to improve sight lines exiting Allerton Road westbound.
- TC87-21 COUNCILORS GREENBERG, LEARY AND OLIVER, requesting to discuss, review and potentially change all the parking regulations along the entire length of Adams Street in Nonantum, on both sides, to better address current land uses and parking needs along the corridor.

During 2021, Traffic Council did not deny any item that was discussed. The following is the only Traffic Council item that was appealed to City Council in 2021:

• TC54-21 COUNCILORS BOWMAN, DANBERG, KALIS, AND RYAN requesting to review and potentially approve stop signs at the following locations as they intersect with Parker Street: 1. Howe Road, westbound; 2. Marcellus Drive, eastbound; 3. Whitlessey Road, westbound; 4. Melina Road, westbound; 5. Howley Avenue, eastbound; 6. Parker Terrace, westbound; 7. Roosevelt Road, westbound; 8. Parker Road, eastbound; 9. Truman Road, eastbound; 10. Kendall Road, eastbound; 11. Parker Avenue, eastbound; 12. Stearns Street, eastbound; 13. Walter Street, westbound; 14. Browning Road, eastbound; 15. Ridge Avenue, westbound ACTION: APPROVE 5-0. Traffic Council voted add all 15 stop signs. An appeal was filed to prevent the installation of a stop sign at the intersection of Parker Road & Parker Street. CITY COUNCIL SUBSEQUENTLY VOTED TO DENY THE APPEAL, THEREBY UPHOLDING THE VOTE OF THE TRAFFIC COUNCIL.

Honorable City Councilors:

I respectfully submit this docket item to this Honorable Council requesting the creation of a Permanent Outdoor Dining Program for Newton restaurants to include:

- (1) Granting of administrative authority to the Commissioner of Public Works, the Director of Planning and Development, and the Police Chief to seasonably approve the use of on-street parking space for restaurant outdoor dining. As the City Council decides on this permanent change, the City has docketed with the Traffic Council the continuation of a temporary policy allowing DPW to approve on-street dining in parking spaces, similar to what happened during 2021. This item will be heard by the Traffic Council on Jan. 20, 2022.
- (2) Establishing an annual fee for \$250 per parking space for approved outdoor dining spaces and requesting such fee be waived for calendar year 2022.
- (3) Amending the Health and Human Services General Ordinance Section 12-70 (Permits for café furniture on sidewalks) (a) (3) in the following manner:

Sec. 12-70 (c) (3):

The number, type and placement of such tables, chairs, benches, shade umbrellas, barriers and other appurtenances shall be subject to the approval of the commissioner, in consultation with other appropriate departments of the city, including the fire, police, public works, inspectional services and planning departments, and in conformity with any applicable ordinances or general laws. Subject to the discretion of the commissioner, after consultation with the fire, police, public works, inspectional services and planning departments, permits may be granted to allow for the placement of up to eight (8) chairs or a number of chairs that represents ten percent (10%) of the total seating capacity for the licensed premises, whichever is greater.

(4) Identifying the City pathway for restaurants seeking to continue to maintain outdoor dining on private property.

Please see the attached memo from the Planning & Development Department's outdoor dining team (Commissioner Heath, Economic Development Director Bailin, Transportation Planning Director Freedman).

As the City Council decides on a permanent change, the City has docketed with Traffic Council the continuation of allowing DPW to approve on a case by case basis the use of on-street parking spaces for outdoor dining as had been the process for 2021. This item is scheduled to be heard by Traffic Council on January 20, 2022.
- (2) Establishing an annual fee for \$250 per parking space for approved outdoor dining spaces and requesting such fee be waived for calendar year 2022
- (3) Amending the Health and Human Services General Ordinance Section 12-70 (Permits for café furniture on sidewalks) (a) (3) in the following manner:

Sec. 12-70 (c) (3):


The number, type and placement of such tables, chairs, benches, shade umbrellas, barriers and other appurtenances shall be subject to the approval of the commissioner, in consultation with other appropriate departments of the city, including the fire, police, public works, inspectional services and

planning departments, and in conformity with any applicable ordinances or general laws. Subject to the discretion of the commissioner, after consultation with the fire, police, public works, inspectional services and planning departments, permits may be granted to allow for the placement of up to eight (8) chairs or a number of chairs that represents ten percent (10%) of the total seating capacity for the licensed premises, whichever is greater.

(4) Identifying the necessary pathway for restaurants seeking to maintain outdoor dining on private property.

Dear Councilors Crossley, Downs, and Humphrey:

At our October meeting, we viewed a presentation from George Kirby about various possible extensions to the Upper Falls Greenway. Included in that presentation was a vision statement concerning a proposed bridge over Route 128. The Area Council met in November and unanimously approved the following vision statement:

By connecting Newton Upper Falls with Needham Heights, the proposed Community Bridge over Route 128 would provide active transportation and recreation access across the Charles River regional development area. The Upper Falls Greenway currently extends to the river, with upcoming spur connections to the Charles River Pathway in Newton, DCR trails along the river, and the Needham Crossing industrial area for recreational trail circulation and commuting. The Community Bridge across Route 128 would allow shopping and dining access and quality of life improvements to residents on both sides, plus access to the upcoming Northland mixed-use area and to the further growth anticipated at the Muzi parcel in Needham. The Community Bridge would make possible a regional greenway that could eventually connect Newton, Needham, Dover, and Medfield, providing residents the opportunity to enjoy an off-road bicycle and pedestrian experience rivaling the popular Minuteman Trail.

The Community Bridge project should be initiated with a community development and engineering study of the proposed bridge over Route 128 and rehabilitation of the Charles River Sunset Deck rail bridge connecting to the Upper Falls Greenway.

Please feel free to share this with your City Council colleagues as evidence of the Upper Falls's views on the Community Bridge project.

Whereas the Upper Falls Greenway is a beloved active bicycle and pedestrian transportation corridor connecting Upper Falls almost to Newton Highlands center, and

Whereas the City of Newton plans to connect the Greenway to Newton Highlands T stop & center, and

Whereas the Town of Needham Selectboard has a goal of connecting to the Greenway from the south, and

Whereas the development of multi-modal transportation options between the town and the City of Newton would likely benefit residents and businesses on both sides of the river and highway, and

Whereas a connected greenway would allow Needham residents to more easily access the Green Line at Newton Highlands and Newton residents to access the Commuter Rail at Needham Heights, and

Whereas the Upper Falls Greenway could further connect not just to trails along the Newton side of the Charles River (planned), but also to trails in Needham, and

Whereas the Muzi parcel as well as the Northland development will add population and businesses to both municipalities in upcoming years, and

Whereas the Needham portion of the rail trail is planned to extend and add recreational access through Dover to Medfield

Therefore, be it resolved that the City Council of Newton supports and encourages our mayor, and legislative delegation to join us in supporting a community development, engineering feasibility and preliminary design study toward the vision of a Community Bridge over Route 128 and rehabilitation of the Charles River "Sunset Deck" rail bridge connecting to the Upper Falls Greenway.
