Old Line

The town of Newton, the Indian name of which was Neocantum, was incorporated in 1631. Its centre in 1810 was 1700, in 1820 1650, in 1831 1577, in 1840 1497, in 1848 1431. This town including one half of Chittenden Boston and Worcester had 1000 trees through the market's part of the town about 4 miles. The orchard contains the nucleus of Lake Cochichewick with the centre of the town about 5 1/2 miles - 2400 ft. of which is unimproved. Its public buildings are 8 meetinghouses, a theological seminary established in 1825, an Academy, and 11 School houses. Also a normal school at West Newton, belonging to the State.
