The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. with Italo Visco presiding as Chair. Voting permanent member were D. Capasso, and P. Dudek. R. Alfred was appointed to vote as a full member. V. Birmingham acted as recording secretary and the meeting was recorded on Zoom.

298 Central Street – Certificate of Appropriateness

J. Strickland presented an application to replace existing four-foot-tall fence sections with six-foot-tall cedar privacy fence. The owners also wanted to install six-foot-tall cedar privacy fences on each side of the property and at the back of the driveway.

There was discussion about how well the proposed fence design fit in with the neighboring fences. I. V. noted that only the section at the end of the driveway would be very visible. R. Alfred was concerned that the design of the visible fence section be consistent with what the commission required of other owners which was that the fencing not present as walling off the property. He noted that the commission had required lattice toppers for similar fences. D. Capasso moved to grant a Certificate of Appropriateness for the application as submitted



with requirements for the fence section at the end of the driveway. P. Dudek seconded the motion. There was a roll call vote and the motion passed unanimously, 4-0.
