**Clerk's Note:** Councilor Norton originally docketed this item in order to be sure that there was some control over drones. She place the item on Second Call and noted that the FAA already requires drones to be registered. In the case where someone does not register, Councilor Norton said she was doubtful

that they would register with the City. She has concerns about over regulating this new technology. She is not sure that a Newton registration is needed on top of an FAA registration. The Police Chief is comfortable that if there is some misuse of a drone, the owner can be identified through the FAA registration. Councilor Norton moved an amendment to remove the section of the ordinance requiring a Newton registration.

It was felt by several Councilors that the ordinance stay as it was presented by the Law Department be approved. Part of the value of the local registration is it forms an educational opportunity that allows residents to understand the rules in the local context. It was also noted that only unmanned aircraft of more than .55 lbs must be registered with FAA and that the FAA only controls airspace 400 ft and above. The City controls 400 ft and below.

There was some discomfort expressed about discussing the substantive policy issue of whether there should be fees for registration or not on the floor of the Council. More information was also requested before a vote be taken.

It was noted by the Chair of Finance that concern regarding the costs to students who may have several small drones could be expensive if all had to be registered was discussed in Finance. That has been clarified and an owner just has to register once at \$10.00.

It was felt that more work was needed on this and that a motion be made to refer the item back to Public Safety. Councilor Norton withdrew her amendment and a roll call vote referred the item back to the Public Safety & Transportation Committee.

**Clerk's Note:** Councilor Sangiolo put the six items above on Second Call and requested that these six items be taken as a package. She moved that they be recommitted to Committee. She had issues with the appointments and reappointments as she felt that they didn't necessarily reflect the diversity of the community. She was concerned with the process and had questions about a member who was not reappointed who she felt was very qualified.

The Chair of the Zoning & Planning Committee was opposed to the motion to send the items back to Committee. He noted that he had raised issues with the Mayor and the current Director of Planning and was satisfied with their explanations, but not happy with the outcome. The Zoning Board of Appeal (ZBA) only had two female members and he would like to see more diversity with gender and other issues. He felt that it was an issue that is not just confined to the ZBA and noted that there really is not a great deal of recruiting going on with respect to any of the positions. Currently positions are advertised and then the Mayor delegates interviewing the applicants to his staff to see who has

qualifications as well as an interest in particular committee. They then they forward their nominations to the committees for approval.

The Chair noted that if these items are recommitted to the committee, they won't be able to be scheduled until July. At that point, the time to take any action will have lapsed and he did not want to see more discussion in the context of these current appointments. There were no negative votes from the Committee and the Committee took the time to interview each of these appointments.

Several Councilors noted that the ZBA is very important and that it is the Council's job to look into this to make sure that the Administration is looking for good candidates to sit on all of the other Boards and Commissions.

There was dissatisfaction by several Councilors regarding a female member that was not reappointed.

It was discussed that if recommittal to ZAP was not a good option then postponing the item until the next Council meeting was appropriate. This would give time for the Mayor to provide more information in order to try and understand why a particular female, who had been doing a good job listens to all parties, and has a particular expertise in certain zoning matters, was not re-appointed. It was also noted that if the appointments are voted tonight, there would be no flexibility for this person to be possibly reappointed.

It was noted that an important and productive element in a public body is diversity of viewpoint regardless of physical characteristics and absent another explanation, it seems that the ZBA is becoming less diverse in its viewpoints. The ZBA has a tremendous amount of authority; it functions in almost a quasi-judicial function. Diversity is important including the diversity of point of view. Concern was also raised that the ZBA was becoming predominately male.

It was felt by some that there is currently a diversity of opinion in this group of people.

Several Councilors who supported recommittal were concerned that the motion to recommit may not achieve the objective of having an opportunity to sort this out before the next meeting of the Council where an actual vote could be taken. It was noted that postponing the matter to the next full Council meeting gives a chance to sort out some of these issues.

Councilor Sangiolo stated the if there were issues regarding constructive grant of approval because of the August 5<sup>th</sup> deadline, she and would be open to postponing the items for two weeks.

A motion to postpone the item to a date certain of Monday, July 11<sup>th</sup> was requested to replace recommittal. Councilor Sangiolo withdrew her motion and, on a voice vote, the six items were postponed to a date certain of July 11<sup>th</sup>.
