The City of Newton invites sealed bids in accordance with M.G.L. c.30, §39M from Contractors for:

ANNUAL CONTRACT FOR INSTALLATION OF REFLECTIVE PAVEMENT MARKINGS

Bids will be received until: 10:30 a.m, Thursday, June 30, 2022

at the Purchasing Department, Room 108, Newton City Hall, 1000 Commonwealth Avenue, Newton, MA 02459. Bids will not be accepted nor may submitted bids be corrected, modified or withdrawn after the deadline for bids. Immediately following the deadline for bids, all bids received within the time specified will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The work of this contract includes furnishing labor, equipment and materials for installing and removing pavement markings in the form of crosswalks, centerlines and other markings on pavement throughout the City of Newton.

Only contractors prequalified by the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) are eligible to bid on this contract. MassDOT will provide a list of Prequalified Construction Contractors to the City of Newton. Bidders will be verified at time of Bid Opening.

Contract Documents will be available on line at www.newtonma.gov/bids or for pickup at the Purchasing Department after 10:00 a.m., June 16, 2022. There will be no charge for contract documents. Bids must be submitted with one ORIGINAL and one COPY. All bids must be accompanied by a bid deposit in an amount that is not less than five percent (5%) of the value of the bid, including all add alternates, if any.

The term of all contracts **shall extend from day of contract execution through June 30, 2023**. The City shall have the option, at its sole discretion, to renew a contract for **two (2) additional one year terms**

The City is soliciting bids for two (2) types of work: Long Line Work (Group 1) and Hand Work (2). Award(s) will be made to the responsible and eligible bidder(s) offering the lowest bids for each Group. In addition the City may elect, at its option, to award contracts to the responsible and eligible bidder(s) offering the second and third lowest bids for each Group, with the result that the City may award multiple contracts for each Group should it be deemed to be in the best interest of the City to do so.

Contract awards will be made by Group, so bidders may bid on one or both Groups.

All bids are subject to the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 30, Section 39M. Wages are subject to minimum wage rates determined by the Massachusetts Department of Labor and Industries pursuant to M.G.L. Chapter 149, Sec. 26 to 27H. The schedule of wage rates applicable to this contract is included in the bidding documents. In addition, the prevailing wage schedule will be <u>updated annually</u> for all public construction projects lasting longer than one (1) year. You will be required to pay the rates set out in any updated prevailing wage schedule. Increases in prevailing wage schedules will not be the basis for change order requests. The successful bidder will be required to provide a Certificate of Insurance demonstrating current coverage of the type and amounts set forth in the Project Manual. The successful bidder will be required to furnish both a Labor and Materials Payment Bond in the amount of 50% of the contract total.

The costs of any bond and any insurance required in this Invitation For Bid are the responsibility of the bidder; such costs will not be reimbursed by City and should be included in your bid.

Time is of the essence in the performance of the work of this contract.

Bidders attention is directed to the requirements of the City of Newton Supplemental Equal Employment Opportunity, Anit-Discriminitation and Affirmative Action Program and also to the Minority/Women Business Enterprise Plan, December 1999, which is hereby incorporated into the Contract Documents.

All City of Newton bids are available on the City's web site, www.newtonma.gov/bids Invitation for Bid. It is the sole responsibility of the contractor downloading these bids to ensure they have received any and all addenda prior to the bid opening. Addenda's will be available online within the original bid document as well as a separate file. If you download bids from the internet site and would like to make it known that your company has done so, you may fax the Purchasing Department (617) 796-1227 or email to purchasing@newtonma.gov with your NAME, ADDRESS, PHONE, FAX AND INVITATION FOR BID NUMBER.

The City may reject any and all proposals in accordance with applicable law. In addition, the City reserves the right to waive minor informalities in any or all bids, or to reject any or all proposals (in whole or in part) if it be in the public interest to do so.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

ARTICLE 1 - BIDDER'S REPRESENTATION

- 1.1 Each General Bidder (hereinafter called the "Bidder") by making a bid (hereinafter called "bid") represents that:
 - 1. The Bidder has read and understands the Bidding Documents, Contract Forms, General Conditions, Conditions of the Contract, General Requirements and Project Specification (collectively, referred to as the "Contract Documents") and the bid is made in accordance therewith.
 - 2. The Bidder is familiar with the local conditions under which the work has to be performed.
- 1.2 Failure to so examine the Contract Documents or become familiar with local conditions will not relieve any Bidder from any obligation under the bid as submitted.

ARTICLE 2 - REQUEST FOR INTERPRETATION

- 2.1 Bidders shall promptly notify the City of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or error which they may discover upon examination of the Contract Documents, the site, and local conditions.
- 2.2 Bidders requiring clarification or interpretation of the Contract Documents shall make a written request to the *Chief Procurement Officer*, at purchasing@newtonma.gov or via facsimile (617) 796-1227. The City will answer such requests if received by **Friday, June 24, 2019 at 12:00 noon.**
- 2.3 Interpretation, correction, or change in the Contract Documents will be made by Addendum which will become part of the Contract Documents. The City will not be held accountable for any oral instruction.
- 2.4 Addenda will be emailed to every individual or firm on record as having taken a set of Contract Documents.
- 2.5 Copies of addenda will be made available for inspection at the location listed in the Invitation for Bids where Contract Documents are on file, in addition to being available online at www.newtonma.gov/bids.
- 2.6 Bidders or proposers contacting ANY CITY EMPLOYEE regarding an Invitation for Bid (IFB) or a Request for Proposal (RFP), outside of the Purchasing Department, once an IFB or RFP has been released, may be disqualified from the bidding process.
- 2.7 Bidders downloading information off the internet web site are soley responsible for obtaining any addenda prior to the bid opening. If the bidder makes themselves known to the Purchasing Department, at purchasing@newtonma.gov or via facsimile (617) 796-1227, they shall be placed on the bidder's list. Bidders must provide the Purchasing Department with their company's name, street address, city, state, zip, phone, fax, email address and INVITATION FOR BID #22-103.

ARTICLE 3 - MBE PARTICIPATION

- 3.1 Notice is hereby given that the Mayor's Affirmative Action Plan for the City of Newton in effect at the time of this solicitation is applicable to all construction contracts in excess of \$10,000.00.
- 3.2 Notice is hereby given that the City of Newton Minority/Women Business Enterprise Plan and the Supplemental Equal Employment Opportunity Anti-Discrimination and Affirmative Action Program in effect at the time of this solicitation are applicable to all City contracts for goods and services in excess of \$50,000.00.
- 3.3 Copies of the Plans and Program referred to in Sections 3.1 and 3.2 are available at: www.newtonma.gov/purchasing.

ARTICLE 4 - PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 4.1 Bids shall be submitted on the "Bid Form #22-103," attached.
- 4.2 All entries on the Bid Form shall be made by typewriter or in ink.
- 4.3 Where so indicated on the Bid Form, sums shall be expressed in both words and figures. Where there is a discrepancy between the bid sum expressed in words and the bid sum expressed in figures, the words shall control.
- 4.4 Bid Deposits shall be submitted in the amount specified in the Invitation for Bids. They shall be made payable to the City and shall be either in the form of cash, certified check, treasurer's or cashier's check issued by a responsible bank or trust company, or a bid bond issued by a surety licensed to do business in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and shall be conditioned upon the faithful performance by the principal of the agreements contained in the bid. Bidders are reminded that the bid deposit covers the City for damages when a bidder withdraws its bid after the bid submission date. Bid advised that to the extent permitted by law the City will retain all bid deposits for withdrawn bids.

Bid deposits of the three (3) lowest responsible and eligible Bidders shall be retained until the execution and delivery of the City/Contractor agreement.

- 4.5 The Bid, including the bid deposit shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope with the following plainly marked on the outside:
 - * GENERAL BID FOR: #22-103
 - * NAME OF PROJECT: Annual Contract for Installation of Reflective Pavement Markings
 - * BIDDER'S NAME, BUSINESS ADDRESS, AND PHONE NUMBER
- 4.6 Date and time for receipt of bids is set forth in the Invitation for Bids.
- 4.7 Timely delivery of a bid at the location designated shall be the full responsibility of the Bidder. In the event that Newton City Hall is closed on the date or at the time that bids are due, the date and time for receipt of bids shall be on the next business day following that the Newton City Hall and the Purchasing Department are open.
- 4.8 Bids shall be submitted with one original and one copy.
- 4.9 Massachusetts law requires all employees who work on Massachusetts public works construction sites must have no Less than 10 hours of OSHA-approved safety and health training. See M.G.L. c.30, §39M(c), M.G.L. c.30, §39S(a)(1), M.G.L. c.149, §44E(2) & M.G.L. c.149, §44F(2).
 - 1. This requirement will apply to any general bid or sub bid submitted.
 - 2. This law directs the Massachusetts Attorney General to restrain the award of construction contracts to any contractor who is in violation to this requirement and to restrain the performance of these contracts by non-complying contractors.
 - 3. The contractor and all subcontractors on this project must certify on the Bid Form compliance with the applicable requirement. Non-compliance with this law will disqualify the bidder.

ARTICLE 5 - ALTERNATES

- 5.1 Each Bidder shall acknowledge Alternates (if any) in Section C on the Bid Form.
- 5.2 In the event an Alternate does not involve a change in the amount of the base bid, the Bidder shall so indicated by writing "No Change", or "N/C" or "0" in the space provided for that Alternate.
- 5.3 Bidders shall enter on the Bid Form a single amount for each Alternate which shall consist of the amount for work performed by the Contractor.
- 5.4 The low Bidder will be determined on the basis of the sum of the base bid and the accepted alternates.

ARTICLE 6 - WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the time designated for receipt of bids on written or electronic request. Electronic withdrawal of bids must be confirmed over the Bidder's signature by written notice postmarked on or before the date and time set for receipt of bids.

- 6.2 Withdrawn bids may be resubmitted up to the time designated for the receipt of bids.
- 6.3 No bids shall be withdrawn within thirty days, Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after the opening of the bids.

ARTICLE 7 - CONTRACT AWARD

- 7.1 The City is soliciting bids to provide the estimated materials and labor for two Groups of work as set forth in the Item Sheets at pp. 12-13 below and in the Special Provisions at pp. 68-72 for "On Call" Annual Installation of Reflective Pavement Markings. It is the City's intent to award up to three (3) contracts by Group to responsive and eligible Bidders offering the lowest Total Prices for Fiscal Year 2023 (FY23)¹ as set forth in their respective Bid Form #22-103. Contracts will be awarded within sixty (60) days, Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded, after the opening of bids. Primary Contracts will be awarded to the bidder(s) submitting the lowest FY23 Total Prices. Each Group Primary Contractor shall provide services for routine marking projects. In the event that the Group Primary Contractor is unable to provide requested services under the contract, the City shall request the services from the second lowest bidder. If the secondary bidder is unable to provide such services, it shall go to the third lowest bidder. In addition, the City reserves the right, should it so elect, to solicit estimates of the number of hours and materials costs needed to complete work identified by the City as a "special project." The City will obtain an estimate of hours from the Primary Contractor as well as the two (2) other contractors selected as lowest responsive and eligible bidders. The work on such special project will be given to the one of the three contractors whose number of hours times its hourly rate(s) plus materials costs result in the lowest special project price. A "special project" is one for substantial nonrecurring work involving such things as the drawing of permits or architect's drawings, or a project cost of more than \$25,000.
- 7.2 The City of Newton reserves the right to waive minor informalities in or to reject any or all Bids if it be in the public interest to do so.
- 7.3 The City reserves the right to reject any bidder who has failed to pay any local taxes, fees, assessments, betterments, or any other municipal charge, unless the bidder has a pending abatement application or has entered into a payment agreement with the collector-treasurer.
- 7.4 As used herein, the term "lowest responsible and eligible Bidder" shall mean the Bidder (1) whose bid is the lowest of those bidders possessing the skill, ability and integrity necessary for the faithful performance of the work; (2) who has met all the requirements of the invitation for bids; (3) who shall certify that he is able to furnish labor that can work in harmony with all other elements of labor employed or to be employed in the work; (4) who, where the provisions of section eight B of chapter twenty-nine apply, shall have been determined to be qualified thereunder.
- 7.5 Subsequent to the award and within five (5) days, Saturday, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after the prescribed forms are presented for signature, the successful Bidder shall execute and deliver to the City a Contract in the form included in the Contract Documents in such number of counterparts as the City may require.
- 7.6 In the event that the City receives low bids in identical amount from two or more responsive and responsible Bidders, the City shall select the successful Bidder by a blind selection process chosen by the City such as flipping a coin or drawing names from a hat. The low Bidders who are under consideration will be invited to attend and observe the selection process.

ARTICLE 8 - TAXES

- 8.1 The Bidder shall not include in this bid any tax imposed upon the sale or rental of tangible personal property in this Commonwealth, such as any and all building materials, supplies, services and equipment required to complete the work.
- 8.2 The City is exempt from payment of the Massachusetts Sales Tax, and the Bidder shall not include any sales tax on its bid. The City's exemption Number is E-046-001-404.

¹ The contract for this bid is for one year, with two (2) one year options, exercisable by the City, to extend. Since the options may not be exercised, the awards are based solely on the FY23 Total Contract Price. However, if an option is exercised, the contractor's compensation shall be its Total Price for the applicable fiscal year.

ARTICLE 9 – PROPRIETARY SPECIFICATIONS

- 9.1 The City has used a proprietary specification to describe the supply listed in the specifications. Such specifications are permitted under M.G.L. c. 30, §39M(b), provided that the City states in writing that use of the proprietary specification is in its best interest and that it will accept an "equal" of the item specified. An item is considered equal if (i) it is at least equal in quality, durability, appearance, strength, and design; (ii) will perform the intended function at least equally; and (iii) conforms substantially, even with deviations, to the detailed requirements contained in the specifications. In the event that the Bidder wishes to substitute an equal item, it may do so either in its bid or proposal or after the contract is awarded but before a contract is executed, it being understood that the award shall be conditioned on the Bidder providing the item originally specified or an equal item accepted by the City and identified in the contract. In no event shall the Bidder be entitled to offer, or the City obliged to consider, the substitution of an item as equal after execution of a contract. In the event the Bidder substitutes or attempts to substitute an "equal" item after that date, it shall be in breach thereof and be liable for actual and consequential damages resulting from its failure to perform as agreed. The City shall have the sole right to determine whether or not said item is equal.
- 9.2 The required determination and justification have been duly prepared, and a copy may be requested in accordance with the Massachusetts Public Records Law, M.G.L. c. 66, §10.

As used in this subsection the word "person" shall mean any natural person, joint venture, partnership, corporation or other business or legal entity. The undersigned further certifies under penalty of perjury that the said undersigned is not presently debarred from doing public construction work in the Commonwealth under the provisions of section twenty-nine F of chapter twenty-nine, or any other applicable debarment provisions of any other chapter of the General Laws or any rule or regulation promulgated thereunder.

CITY OF NEWTON GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION

1.0 **DEFINITIONS**

1.1 THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

The term "Contract Documents" sometimes also referred to as the "Contract", means the contract entered into between the City of Newton (hereinafter "City") and the Contractor. It includes the Invitation for Bid, General Bid Form, Contract Form, these General Conditions of the Contract, Supplements and Amendments to the General Conditions (if any), Contract Specifications, Drawings, all addenda issued prior to execution of the contract, the Bid Bond, the Labor and Material Payment Bond, or other assurances of completion, the applicable wage rate determinations, and other documents listed in the Agreement and modifications issued after execution of the contract.

1.2 THE WORK

The term "Work", sometimes also referred to as the "Project", means the construction and services required by the Contract Documents, whether completed or partially completed, and includes all other labor, materials, equipment, and services provided or to be provided by the Contractor to fulfill the Contractor's obligation.

1.3 OWNER

The term "Owner" is the City of Newton.

1.4 CONTRACT OFFICER

The term "Contract Officer" means the person appointed by the Owner to administer the terms of the Contract between the Owner and the Contractor, who is also empowered to take certain actions under this Agreement.

1.5 CONTRACTOR

- 1.5.1 The Contractor, sometimes referred to as the General Contractor, is the person or entity identified as such throughout the Contract Documents as if singular in number. The term Contractor means the Contractor or its authorized representative.
- 1.5.2 The Contractor shall supervise and direct the Work, using the Contractor's best skill and attention. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for and have control over construction means, methods, techniques, sequences and procedures, and for coordinating all portions of the Work under the Contract.

1.6 SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION

The term "Substantial Completion" means the value of the work remaining to be performed by the Contractor is, in the estimate of the awarding authority, less than one percent (1%) of the original contract price.

2.0 CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

2.1 PRE-CONSTRUCTION CONFERENCE

- 2.1.1 Prior to commencement of the Work, the Contractor shall meet in conference with representatives of the Owner regarding the Owner's requirements under the Contract for administration of the quality assurance program, safety program, labor provisions, the schedule of work, and other Contract procedures.
- 2.1.2 The Contractor shall begin work upon receipt of a written Notice to Proceed from the Contract Officer or designee. The Contractor shall not begin work prior to receiving such notice.

2.2 CONTRACT PERIOD

The Contractor shall complete all work required under this contract within the timeframe specified elsewhere in this document, or within the time schedule established in the notice to proceed issued by the Contracting Officer.

2.3 REJECTION OF DEFECTIVE MATERIALS AND WORK

The Owner's inspection of the Work shall not relieve the Contractor of any of its responsibilities to fulfill the Contract obligations, and defective work shall be corrected without cost to the Owner. Unsuitable work may be rejected by the Owner, notwithstanding that such work and materials have been previously overlooked or misjudged by the Owner and accepted for payment. If the Work or any part thereof shall be found defective at any time before the final acceptance of the whole Work, the Contractor shall forthwith correct such defect in a manner satisfactory to the Owner, and if any material brought upon the site for use in the Work, or selected for the same, shall be rejected by the Owner as unsuitable or not in conformity with the Contract requirements, the Contractor shall forthwith remove such materials from the vicinity of the Work.

2.4 CHANGES

2.4.1 All changes in the work including any increase, decrease, or other equitable adjustment in the Contract price or in the time for performing the Contract, shall be authorized in writing by the Owner and/or Contract Officer prior to commencement.

2.5 CONTRACT PRICE

The Contract Price is stated in the Contract Form, and including authorized adjustments, is the total amount payable by the Owner to the Contractor for performance of the Work under the Contract Documents.

2.6 APPLICATIONS FOR PAYMENT

- 2.6.1 Once each month, on a date established by the Owner at the beginning of the Work, the Contractor shall deliver to the Owner an itemized Application for Payment, supported by such data substantiating the Contractor's right to payment as the Owner may require, and reflecting a minimum of 5% retainage until the final acceptance and payment by the Owner.
- 2.6.2 The Owner shall make payment to the Contractor within 30 days of receipt of said application, less any applicable retainage.
- 2.6.3 The Owner may make changes in any application for payment submitted by the Contractor for:
 - i. Retention based on the value of its claims against the Contractor,
 - ii. Retention of 5% of the approved amount of the Application for Payment.

2.7 FINAL PAYMENT

The acceptance by the Contractor of the last payment due under this Contract or the execution of the Final Certificate of Completion, shall operate as a release to the Owner from all claims and liability related to this Contract.

2.8 GUARANTY AND WARRANTY

2.8.1 WARRANTY

The Contractor warrants to the Owner that materials and equipment furnished under the Contract will be of good quality and new unless otherwise required or permitted by the Contract Documents, that the Work will be free from defects not inherent in the quality required or permitted, and that the Work will conform with the requirements of the Contract Documents. Work not conforming to these requirements, including substitutions not properly approved and authorized, may be considered defective. If required by the Owner, the Contractor shall furnish satisfactory evidence as to the kind and quality of materials and equipment.

2.8.2 GENERAL GUARANTY

If at any time during the period of one (1) year from the date of Substantial Completion of the Work to be performed under this Contract, any part of the Work shall, in the reasonable determination of the Owner, require replacing or repairing due to the fact that it is broken, defective, or otherwise does not conform to the Contract Documents, the Owner will notify the Contractor to make the required repairs or replacement. If the Contractor shall neglect to commence such repairs or replacement to the satisfaction of the Owner within ten (10) days from the date of giving or mailing such notice, then the Owner may employ other persons to make the same.

The Contractor agrees, upon demand, to pay to the Owner all amounts which the Owner expends for such repairs or replacements. During this one year guarantee period any corrective work shall be performed in accordance with the applicable terms of this Contract. For items of work completed after use and occupancy has been taken, the one year guarantee shall commence at the time the Owner accepts such items. This one year guarantee shall not limit any express guaranty or warranty provided elsewhere in the Contract.

2.9 INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

2.9.2 OWNER AS CO-INSURED

The Owner shall be named as additional insureds on the Contractor's Liability Policies.

2.9.3 CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE, POLICIES

- i. The Contractor shall not commence the work until proof of compliance with this Section 2.9 has been furnished to the Owner by submitting one copy of a properly endorsed insurance certificate issued by a company authorized to write insurance in the Commonwealth. This certificate shall indicate that the contractual liability coverage is in force.
- ii. The Contractor shall file the original and one certified copy of all policies with the Owner within fifteen (15) days after contract award. If the Owner is damaged by the Contractor's failure to maintain such insurance and to so notify the Owner, then the Contractor shall be responsible for all reasonable costs attributable thereto.

2.9.4 CANCELLATION

Cancellation of any insurance required by this contract, whether by the insurer or the insured, shall not be valid unless written notice thereof is given by the party proposing cancellation to the other party and Owner at least thirty days prior to the effective date thereof, which shall be expressed in said notice.

2.10 INDEMNIFICATION

The Contractor shall take all responsibility for the Work and take all precautions for preventing injuries to persons and property in or about the Work; shall bear all losses resulting to or on account of the amount or character of the Work. The Contractor shall pay or cause payment to be made for all labor performed or furnished and for all materials used or employed in carrying out this Contract. The Contractor shall assume the defense of, and indemnify and save harmless the Owner, and the Owner's officers and agents from all claims relating to labor performed or furnished and materials used or employed for the Work; to inventions, patents and patent rights used in and in doing the Work unless such patent infringement is due to a product or process specified by the Owner; to injuries to any person or corporation received or sustained by or from the Contractor and any employees, and subcontractors and employees, in doing the work, or in consequence of any improper materials, implements or labor used or employed therein; and to any act, omission or neglect of the Contractor and any employees therein.

2.11 BONDS

The Contractor shall provide the Owner with a performance and with a payment or labor and materials bond in the form provided by the Owner, executed by a surety company licensed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Division of Insurance. Such bond shall be in an amount equal to at least one half of the Contract price unless otherwise stated in the Contract Documents. All bonds shall be accompanied by a current power of attorney.

2.12 TERMINATION

2.12.1 TERMINATION FOR CAUSE

- i. The Owner may terminate this contract for cause if it determines that any of the following circumstances have occurred:
 - a. The Contractor is adjudged bankrupt or has made a general assignment for the benefit of its creditors.
 - b. A receiver has been appointed of the Contractor's property.
 - c. All or a part of the Work has been abandoned.
 - d. The Contractor has sublet or assigned all or any portion of the Work, the Contract, or claims thereunder, without the prior written consent of the Owner, except as provided in the Contract.
 - e. The Owner has determined that the rate of progress required on the project is not being met.
 - f. The Contractor has substantially violated any provisions of this Contract.
- ii. The Owner may complete the Work, or any part thereof, and charge its expense of so completing the Work or part thereof, to the Contractor.
- iii. The Owner may take possession of and use any materials, machinery, implements and tools found upon the site of said Work. The Owner shall not be liable for any depreciation, loss or damage to said materials, machinery, implements or tools during said use and the Contractor shall be solely responsible for their removal from the Project site after the Owner has no further use for them.

2.12.2 TERMINATION - NO FAULT

- i. In the event that this Contract is terminated by the Owner, prior to the completion of construction and termination is not based on a reason listed in Paragraph 2.12.1, the Contractor shall be compensated for its costs incurred on the Project, including reasonable costs of de-mobilization, covering the period of time between the last approved application for payment and the date of termination.
- ii. Payment by the Owner pursuant to Section 2.7 shall be considered to fully compensate the Contractor for all claims and expenses and those of any consultants, subcontractors, and suppliers, directly or indirectly attributable to the termination, including any claims for lost profits.

2.13 PERMITS, FEES, AND NOTICES

- 2.13.1 The Contractor shall secure and the Owner shall pay for the building permit, if required. The Contractor shall coordinate all efforts required to obtain this permit. All other permits and governmental fees, licenses, and inspections necessary for proper execution and completion of the Work shall be secured and paid for by the Contractor.
- 2.13.2 The Contractor shall comply with and give notices required by laws, ordinances rules, regulations, and lawful orders of public authorities bearing on performance of the Work.
- 2.13.3 If the Contractor performs Work that it knows or reasonably should know is contrary to laws, statutes, ordinances, building codes, and rules and regulations without such notice to the Owner, the Contractor shall assume full responsibility for such Work and shall bear the attributable costs.

2.14 SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

2.14.1 The Contractor shall comply with all Federal, State, and local safety laws and regulations applicable to the Work performed under this Contract.

2.15 TEMPORARY HEATING

Not required; do not install Removal & Installation of Gym Flooring in any space which is not heated properly.

2.16 AVAILABILITY AND USE OF UTILITY SERVICES

2.16.1 The City shall make all reasonably required amounts of utilities available to the Contractor from existing outlets and supplies, as specified in the Contract. Unless otherwise provided in the Contract, the amount of each utility service consumed shall be charged to or paid for by the Contractor at prevailing rates charged to the City or, where the utility is produced by the City, at reasonable rates determined by the Contracting Officer. The Contractor shall carefully conserve any utilities furnished without charge.

2.17 DISPUTES

- 2.17.1 "Claim," as used in this section, means a written demand or written assertion by one of the contracting parties seeking, as a matter of right, the payment of money in a sum certain, the adjustment or interpretation of contract terms, or other relief arising under or relating to the contract. A claim arising under the Contract, unlike a claim relating to the Contract, is a claim that can be resolved under a Contract clause that provides for the relief sought by the claimant. A voucher, invoice, or other routine request for payment that is not in dispute when submitted is not a claim. The submission may be converted to a claim by complying with the requirements of this section, if it is disputed either as to liability or amount or is not acted upon in a reasonable time.
- 2.17.2 All disputes arising under or relating to this Contract, including any claims for damages for the alleged breach thereof which are not disposed of by agreement, shall be resolved under this section.
- 2.17.3 All claims by the Contractor shall be made in writing and submitted to the Contract Officer for a written decision. A claim by the City against the Contractor shall be subject to a written decision by the Contract Officer.
- 2.17.4 The Contract Officer shall, within thirty (30) days after receipt of the request, decide the claim or notify the Contractor of the date by which the decision will be made.
- 2.17.5 The Contract Officer's decision shall be final unless the Contractor (1) appeals in writing to a higher level in the City, (2) refers the appeal to an independent mediator or arbitrator, or (3) files suit in a court of competent jurisdiction. Such appeal must be made within thirty (30) days after receipt of the Contract Officer's decision.
- 2.17.6 The Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of this Contract and/or any authorized change thereof, pending final resolution of any request for relief, claim, appeal, or action arising under or relating to the Contract and/or any authorized change thereof, and comply with any decision of the Contract Officer.

2.18 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

3.0 SALES TAX EXEMPTION AND OTHER TAXES

- 3.0.1 To the extent that materials and supplies are used or incorporated in the performance of this Contract, the Contractor is considered an exempt purchaser under the Massachusetts Sales Act, Chapter 14 of the Acts of 1966.
- 3.0.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for paying all other taxes and tariffs of any sort, related to the Work.

3.1 PROHIBITION AGAINST LIENS

The Contractor is prohibited from placing a lien on the City's property. This prohibition shall apply to all subcontractors at any tier and all materials suppliers.

3.2 ORDER OF PRECEDENCE

In the event of a conflict between these General Conditions and the Specifications, the General Conditions shall prevail. In the event of a conflict between the Contract and any applicable state or local law or regulation, the state or local law or regulation shall prevail; provided that such state or local law or regulation does not conflict with, or is less restrictive than applicable federal law, regulation, or Executive Order. In the event of such a conflict, applicable federal law, regulation, and Executive Order shall prevail.

3.3 EXAMINATION AND RETENTION OF CONTRACTOR'S RECORDS

The City of Newton shall, until three (3) years after final payment under this Contract, have access to and the right to examine any of the Contractor's directly pertinent books, documents, papers, or other records involving transactions related to this Contract for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts, and/or transcriptions.

WAGE RATE REQUIREMENTS

1. GENERAL

- A. This section summarizes the requirements for the payment of wages to laborers and mechanics employed under the Contract.
- **B**. Other duties and requirements of law which may not be specified in this section apply and are inherently a part of the Contract.

2. WAGE RATES

- A. The rate per hour to be paid to mechanics, apprentices, teamsters, chauffeurs, and laborers employed on the Work shall not be less than the rate of wages in the attached "Minimum Wage Rates" as determined by the Commissioner of Labor and Industries. This schedule shall continue to be the minimum rate of wages for said employees during the life of this Contract.
- **B.** Keep posted on the site a legible copy of said schedule. Keep on file the wage rates and classifications of labor employed on this Work in order that they may be available for inspection by the Owner, Administrator, or the Architect.
- **C.** Apprentices employed pursuant to this determination of wage rates must be registered and approved by the State Apprenticeship Council wherever rates for journeymen or apprentices are not listed.
- **D.** Pay reserve police officers employed on the Work the prevailing rate of wages paid to regular police officers as required by M.G.L. c149, Sec. 34B, as amended. Such police officers shall be covered by Workmen's Compensation Insurance and Employers Liability Insurance by the Contractor.
- E. The Contractor and all subcontractors shall, on a weekly basis throughout the term of the contract, provide to the City of Newton certified payroll affidavits verifying compliance with M.G.L. c.149, Sec. 27, 27A and 27B. The Contractor is obiligated to provide such records to the City directly on a weekly basis. The City may assess a penalty of \$100 for each day beyond the required submission date that such records are received, which amount shall be deducted from any amounts to the Contractor from the City. In the event of chronic late submissions, the City shall report the same to the Office of the Attorney General.
- **F.** The Contractor and all subcontractors shall provide a Statement of Compliance within 15 days of the completion of its portion of the work. This statement shall be submitted to the Owner on the form found elsewhere in this section.
- **G.** The Contractor shall maintain accurate and complete records, including payroll records, during the Contract term and for three years thereafter.

- This wage schedule applies only to the specific project referenced at the top of this page and uniquely identified by the "Wage Request
 Number" on all pages of this schedule.
- An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule if it has not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the
 date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK projects (bid pursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the
 GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.
- The wages chedules hall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wages chedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wages chedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or a sub-contractor.
- Apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Mass achusetts Division of Apprentice Standards (DAS).
 Apprentices must keep their apprentice identification card on their persons during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wages chedule. Any apprentice not registered with DAS regardless of whether they are registered with another federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the journeyworker's rate.
- Every contractor or subcontractor working on the construction project must submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of
 Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must
 contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports
 to DLS. For a sample payroll reporting form go to http://www.mass.gov/dob/pw.
- Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wages chedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953.
- Contractors must obtain the wages chedules from awarding authorities. Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing wage rates listed on the wage schedule to all employees who perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and criminal penalties.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR ANNUAL CONTRACT FOR INSTALLATION OF REFLECTIVE PAVEMENT MARKINGS

The work consists of furnishing necessary labor, equipment and materials for installing pavement markings in the form of crosswalks, centerlines, edge lines, symbols, legends, reflectors and other markings as needed on asphalt and concrete roadway surfaces throughout the City of Newton in accordance with these specifications. The contractor shall install pavement markings at locations identified by the City during the course of this contract. The locations of work will be provided to the contractor by the City in the form of lists, maps, sketches, plans, etc. The Contractor will be responsible for physically laying out and marking in the field, all new markings which will be subject to approval by the City prior to final application of the paint material. The Contractor will not be required to layout existing or faded paint markings that simply need to be repainted unless it is necessary to reconfigure the existing markings. Any markings that are applied by the Contractor without the approval of the City, applied incorrectly according to applicable standards or plans/sketches, may be required to be removed at the Contractor's expense.

The City may elect, at its discretion, to award this contract up to three (3) Contractors, should it be deemed to be in the best interest of the City.

All work performed under this contract shall be in conformance with the Massachusetts Highway Department Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges dated 1988; the Supplemental Specifications dated June 15, 2012; the Standard Special Provisions; the Interim Supplemental Specifications dated March 21, 2012; the 2012 Construction Standard Details; the 1996 Traffic Standard Details; and the 2009 "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" with revisions. All work shall also be in conformance with the City's Standard Details for Pavement Markings, which shall be provided to the contractor upon execution of the contract, and as required for any revisions during the contract period.

Qualifications of Bidders

The contractor must have municipal experience, satisfactory to the City, in pavement marking work similar in amount, value, cost, character and proportion.

Prior to award of contract the City may require the contractor to demonstrate they have the necessary facilities; plant; experience and financial resources to perform the work in a satisfactory manner and within the established schedule; and demonstrate they have the required experience to perform work of the same or similar nature.

Dates and Hours of Operation

The work identified in this contract shall be completed between April 1 and November 1 of each year, unless otherwise authorized by the City. The City will prepare the list of painting tasks and provide to the Contractor who will then develop a schedule to complete said tasks. If the contractor is delayed in the prosecution or completion of the work by, or on account of weather conditions; strikes or causes beyond control of the contractor, he shall be entitled to such reasonable extension of time for the completion of work. No claim for an extension of time for any reason shall be allowed unless within three (3) days after such delay occurs, notice in writing of the fact of said delay, its causes, and the extension requested shall be given by the contractor to the Commissioner of Public Works.

The Contractor will be responsible for scheduling the police detail(s) and establishing the meeting place and time. If the Contractor fails to appear per the agreed schedule (i.e. 10:00 pm at Police Headquarters on a specific date) without prior approval from the City, the Contractor will be charged \$1000 per police detail per 4 hours the Contractor is not on site which will be deducted from the Contractor's billing. Similarly, if the Contractor fails to stay longer than 2 hours per the agreed schedule without prior approval from the City, the Contractor will be charged \$500 per police detail per 4 hours the Contractor is not on site which will be deducted from the Contractor's billing. If the Contractor cancels the day of scheduled work for any reason other than due to weather (i.e. rain, snow, temperature, etc.), the Contractor will be charged \$1,500. Similarly, if the Contractor fails to stay longer than 2 hours on the day of scheduled work for any reason other than due to weather, the Contractor will be charged \$1000. At any time, the City may elect to bring in more than one Contractor to complete various pavement marking tasks should it deem in the best interest of the City.

The City shall determine the days and hours of work in advance on a case-by-case basis with safety and maintenance of traffic among those factors used in determining the timing of the work. It is anticipated that this contract will require a combination of daytime (e.g., local streets) and nighttime (e.g., collectors and arterial streets) work.

No work will be accomplished on Sundays, Holidays or special events unless the contractor obtains permission from the City and other legal agencies that might have jurisdiction over work on roads on these days. Special events may include but not be limited to graduations, road races, block parties, village days, funerals, sporting events, etc.

Extension of Time Not a Waiver

Any extension of time beyond the date fixed for completion of the doing and acceptance of any part of the work called for by the contract, shall not be deemed a waiver by the City of its right to annul or terminate the contract for abandonment or delay in the manner provided for nor relieve the contractor from full responsibility and liability.

Employees

The contractor shall employ only competent and skilled employees to do the work required of them. Whenever the Commissioner of Public Works shall notify the contractor that any employee on the work is, in his opinion, incompetent, such men shall be discharged from the work and shall not again be permitted to work upon this contract.

Protection of Work, Property and Persons

The contractor shall take appropriate actions and exercise proper restraint/judgment to adequately protect the operation of the work, specifically adjacent property and the general public during the performance of the work. This includes but is not limited to paint overspray or grinding residue/dust onto on/off-street parked vehicles or vehicles parked in private driveways, vehicles driving over wet paint, etc. Newly painted lines, markings and curb shall be protected from traffic by the use of cones, stationary vehicles or other approved methods until the paint is dry. The Contractor will be responsible for any damage as a result of their operations and will be required to repair, remove or resolve any overspray, "ride overs" at no cost to the City.

Contractor's Liability Insurance

The contractor shall maintain such insurance as will protect him from claim under Workmen's Compensation Acts and other Employer Benefit lets from claims for damages because of bodily injury, including death, and from claims for damages to property which may arise both out of and during operations under this contract whether such operations be by himself or any sub-contractor or anyone directly employed by either of them. Certificates of Insurance and performance bonds shall be submitted to the City on an annual basis.

Work Records

The contractor shall keep a daily diary of all work accomplished and upon the completion of each day's work, shall deliver to the office of the Commissioner of Public Works or his representative via fax or email a copy of the list within 48-hours of completion. The completed work list shall include the street and location by nearest intersection; description of marking; the color of marking; the width of marking, total footage, and date completed.

Maintenance and Final Acceptance

The contractor shall keep and maintain the whole in good repair for a period of ninety days from the date of the completion of the work at the respective locations. It is agreed and understood that he will at any time during this period, upon notification in writing from the Commissioner of Public Works or his representative and without expense to the City, immediately execute all the repairs which may be necessary to be made, as determined by the Commissioner of Public Works or his representative, by reason of defective workmanship, materials or procedures.

Retroreflective markings will be paid for at the contract unit price, which shall be full compensation for cleaning and preparing the pavement surface, for furnishing and placing all materials, and for all materials, labor, tools, equipment and incidentals necessary to complete the work. When markings are found to be non-conforming per these specifications, the contractor shall provide replacement materials at no cost to the City. The contractor shall bear full responsibility for all repair work and associated costs, including purchase of replacement materials. When the fault of non-conformance with the specification is indeterminate or in dispute, the contractor shall provide replacement materials and repair the markings, both at no cost to the City.

Payment will be made against requisitions submitted by the contractor based on work completed satisfactory to the City. Invoices shall include daily work records with the information described in Section 4.6 as back-up. No payment shall be made unless the invoices and work records are provided in a format acceptable to the City. The City may retain 10% of total contract value to be paid to the Contractor if/when the work is finally accepted as provided in section 4.7.

The Contractor will be required to coordinate with the Newton Police Department to have a police detail(s) for the duration of the work. However, the Contractor will not be required to pay for any police details as the Police Department will invoice the Department of Public Works directly.

Estimated Quantities

Quantities shown on the bid forms are estimates only of the amount of work that may be required during the contract period and either more or less of the material will be purchased at the quoted price (s). The City reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity of any particular item of work. When the accepted quantities of work vary from the quantities in the bid schedule, the Contractor shall accept as payment in full, payment at the original contract prices for the accepted quantities of work done. No allowance will be made for any increased expenses, loss of expected reimbursement, loss of anticipated profits suffered or claimed by the Contractor resulting either directly or indirectly from such increased or decreased quantities or from unbalanced allocation among the contract items, loss of overhead expense on the part of the bidder and subsequent loss of expected reimbursement therefore, or from any other cause. Be advised the minimum quantity of glass beads has increased from 6 lbs. per gallon to 8 lbs. per gallon.

Accommodation of Traffic

No roadway shall be closed to traffic in one direction at any time during the performance of the work.

If traffic is unduly hampered or delayed, the City shall direct the Contractor to remove equipment from the work site until such time as traffic returns to normal.

Layout of Work

The contractor shall be responsible for the layout of the work where required by: new pavement, lack of existing legible lines, or for new or modified markings. The City will NOT provide staff to supervise/escort the successful Contractor during the work. The City will provide sketches, maps, drawings, etc. as necessary and whenever possible and coordinate/meet with the Contractor in order to assist with the completion of the work. City staff will evaluate the Contractor's work upon completion of said work and determine if corrections need to be addressed. Where existing lines are sufficiently legible to provide satisfactory guides, layout may be eliminated with approval of the Commissioner of Public Works or his representative.

All pavements shall be broomed/blown clean prior to applying paint material. All loose debris or dirt shall be swept clear of any proposed markings or removed completely from the paved surface by the contractor. Oil, grease, and similar adherent matter shall be removed by washing with a suitable solvent. Excess solvent shall be wiped from the pavement and allowed to evaporate before applying traffic paint. The contractor shall be responsible for any cleaning which may be required.

Prior to installing new thermoplastic pavement markings over existing thermoplastic pavement markings which exhibit a loss of retro-reflectivity but retain the integrity of their bond with the pavement, the existing markings are to be ground with a power grinder of the type used to remove pavement markings. The existing pavement markings shall be ground to a thickness of no more than 30 mills above the surface of the roadway. All residue of the pavement marking removal is to be removed by the contractor prior to the application of the new thermoplastic pavement markings and disposed of by the contractor. The existing markings shall be left in a clean and roughened condition, free of any dirt and debris, prior to the application of the new pavement markings. The total thickness above the roadway of the roughened pavement marking and the new pavement markings shall be no less than 90 mils.

Cleaning, sweeping or roughening of the existing pavement surface shall be considered incidental to the respective items of work which shall include all materials, tools, labor and equipment to complete the work.

ITEM 864. PAVEMENT ARROW REFLECTORIZED WHITE (PAINTED) FT

The work shall consist of furnishing and installing reflectorized painted arrow pavement markings as shown on plans, sketches or as directed by the City. This item shall also include all types of legends and symbols as needed by the City.

Item 864. Pavement Arrow Reflectorized White (Painted) will be measured by the square foot, complete in place, which price shall include all labor, materials, equipment, and incidental costs required to complete the work.

ITEM 866.204 4 INCH REFLECTORIZED WHITE LINE (POLYUREA) FT

ITEM 867.204 4 INCH REFLECTORIZED YELLOW LINE (POLYUREA) FT

Work under these items shall consist of the furnishing and installation of white and lead-free yellow polyurea reflectorized pavement markings (including edge lines, skip lines, and gore lines) on existing and new pavement surfaces. For those locations where permanent pavement has been freshly applied, installation of permanent pavement markings must begin within 14 days of the start of the placement of the top course and must be completed within 14 days of the completion of the top course. As work incidental to these items the Contractor shall measure the performance of the pavement markings upon installation after seven days of installation.

Materials

The polyurea reflectorized pavement marking shall be very fast curing. (no-track times < 10 minutes).

Construction Methods

All work shall be done in accordance with the Material Suppliers specifications and the following:

1. The polyurea binder shall be applied at rates to achieve a minimum uniform wet thickness of 25±2 mils.

Marking Performance

White and yellow markings shall have the following initial Retroreflectance values as measured in accordance with the testing procedures of ASTM D6359. The typical minimum average initial Retroreflectance of the markings shall be 600 [(mcd(ft-2)(fc-1) for white and 400 [(mcd(ft-2)(fc-1) for yellow under dry conditions per ASTM 1710. The typical minimum average initial Retroreflectance of the WET markings shall be 200 [(mcd(ft-2)(fc-1) for white and 175 [(mcd(ft-2)(fc-1) for yellow under wet recovery conditions per ASTM E2177.

The initial performance of the pavement markings shall be measured after seven (7) days of application. The average initial Retroreflectance shall be determined according to the measurement and sampling procedures outlined in ASTM D 6359, using a 30 meter retro reflectometer. The 30 meter retro reflectometer shall measure the coefficient of retro reflected luminance, RL, at an observation angle of 1.05 degrees and an entrance angle of 88.76 degrees. RL shall be expressed in units of millicandelas per square foot-candle [(mcd (ft-2)(fc-1])].

MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

The work under Items 866.204, 867.204 shall be measured as per subsection 860.80 of the standard specifications. The work under Items 866.204, 867.204 will be paid for at the contract unit price per Foot, which price shall include all labor, materials, equipment and incidental costs required to complete the work as specified.

ITEM 873. RESIN IMPRINT SF

The work under this Item shall include the installation of resin imprint where shown on the plans or as directed by the Engineer.

Preparation

Grade

In full-depth reconstruction areas, the width of the sidewalk to receive the resin application shall be paved to within 3/4 inches of the finished pavement surface.

Saw cutting of the existing asphalt or concrete pavement shall be incidental to this item.

The Contractor shall maintain a minimum ten-foot travel lane at all times during this operation.

The Contractor shall prepare the area to receive the resin application according to the resin manufacturer and will not be allowed to proceed with the resin application until the area has been inspected by the resin manufacturer and the Engineer.

Texturized Decorative Surfacing

The Contractor shall be responsible for the preparation, placement and patterning of the resin according to the resin manufacturer and subject to the approval of the Engineer. This synthetic paving material shall be composed of a hot-applied, resin-based compound formulated with a color stable pigment throughout that shall be surface textured to simulate hand laid brick, cobble, stone and/or masonry. The contractor will be required to overlay imprint in previously prepared recessed pavement surfaces as described in the excavation section and/or other areas, as directed and approved by the Engineer.

The Contractor must be a manufacturer authorized applicator, experienced with this specialized system subject to approval by the City of Newton.

This work shall be performed as follows:

- 1. Using manufacturer prescribed methods and equipment, the Contractor shall adequately heat and uniformly mix the imprint material(s) together. The City will select the resin color(s) from the available pigments supplied by the manufacturer. Maximum heating temperature of the completed formulation is 440 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 2. The Contractor shall then apply the heated, mixed resin material to the surface of a hardened, structurally sound bituminous concrete or cement concrete pavement, as directed by the Engineer. The resin material shall be spread to the desired thickness (3/4 inches) using specialized ironing tools, heated sufficiently to smooth the surface to a state of readiness for texturizing. No material shall be applied when precipitation is present or if the pavement surface is wet.
- 3. The color and surface pattern shall be in accordance with the design approved by the City. Texturizing will begin immediately after leveling has occurred, while the material is still hot enough to allow the mold selected, to adequately penetrate the surface and create the desired pattern or form. The resin surface pattern in pedestrian areas shall be generally planar and smooth so as to not interfere with rollability and smoothness of walking surface.
- 4. Once the finished surface has cooled sufficiently, the application area may be opened to vehicular and/or pedestrian traffic.
- 5. Any residue resulting from this work shall be removed and disposed of according by the Contractor and will be considered incidental to this item. The completed work area is to be left in a neat and clean condition.

The resin shall conform to the minimum following physical and performance properties: hot-applied resin-based compound developed specifically for use on bituminous or cement concrete, with superior adhesion, flexibility and abrasion resistance characteristics, as well as color stability, chemical resistance and scrub ability.

The Contractor shall take all precautions and steps during the resin application process to prevent bodily harm or injury, damage to adjacent materials such as new curb, sidewalks, drainage structures or water supply facilities. If during the execution of the work, the Contractor, through willfulness or carelessness, permits or causes any damage to public or private property, the cost of repair or replacement shall be the responsibility of the Contractor at no cost to the City.

The Contractor will be required to own or have access to the required specialized machinery and equipment necessary to perform this work, including but not limited to specialized trucks, compressor, miscellaneous asphalt equipment, dispensers, applicators, cutters and/or specialized tools, etc.

Item 873. Resin Imprint will be measured for payment by the square foot on the pavement surface complete in place, which price shall include all labor, materials, equipment, and incidental costs required to complete the work including asphalt emulsion.
