Bids will be received until:

12:00 P.M., Thursday, June 30, 2022

at the Purchasing Department, Room 108, Newton City Hall, 1000 Commonwealth Avenue, Newton, MA 02459. Bids will not be accepted nor may submitted bids be corrected, modified or withdrawn after the deadline for bids. Following the deadline for bids, all bids received within the time specified will be publicly opened and read aloud.

This Invitation For Bid (IFB) is for furniture, fixtures and equipment (FFE) for the Newton Early Childhood Program located at 687 Watertown Street, Newton, MA 02460 (School).

Contract Documents will be available on line at <u>www.newtonma.gov/bids</u> or for pickup at Newton City Hall, Room 108, Purchasing Department, 1000 Commonwealth Avenue, Newton Centre, MA 02459 after **10:00 a.m., June 16, 2022.**

There will be no charge for contract documents.

A bid deposit in an amount that is not less than five percent (5%) of the value of the bid, <u>including</u> all add alternates, is required. Bid deposits, payable to the City of Newton, shall be either in the form of a bid bond, or cash, or a certified check on, or a treasurer's or cashier's check issued by, a responsible bank or trust company. Bidders are reminded that the bid deposit covers the City for damages when a bidder withdraws its bid after the bid submission date. **Be advised that to the extent permitted by the law the City will retain all bid deposits for withdrawn bids.**

All bids are subject to the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 30, Section 39M. Wages are subject to minimum wage rates determined by the Massachusetts Department of Labor and Industries pursuant to M.G.L. Chapter 149, Sec. 26 to 27H. The schedule of wage rates applicable to this contract is included in the bidding documents. In addition, the prevailing wage schedule will be updated annually for all public construction projects lasting longer than one (1) year. You will be required to pay the rates set out in any updated prevailing wage schedule. Increases in prevailing wage schedules will not be the basis for change order requests. The successful bidder will be required to furnish a Labor and Materials Payment Bond and a Performance Bond, each in the amount of 100% of the contract total. The costs of any bond and any insurance required in this IFB are the responsibility of the bidder; such costs will not be reimbursed by the City and should be included in your bid. The City shall hold all bonds for one (1) year after the expiration of the contract.

One or more contracts will be awarded on a line-item basis for 71 separate items. Bidders' item price shall include all related charges, including freight, delivery, assembly, installation and labor. Bidders shall submit prices by line item on Item Sheet 1 attached hereto as Attachment B. The City has determined that bids can be more accurately and efficiently evaluated if bidders also provide item prices in a separate Excel item spreadsheet (Item Sheet 2), issued with this Invitation For Bid (IFB). Bidders are to provide prices only in accordance with the terms of the IFB. Any bidder that makes changes to Item Sheet 2 or modifies the terms and conditions of the IFB as issued will be automatically disqualified. Awards will be made based on the lowest price for each item, so there may be one contract or as many contracts as there are bidders. Contract(s) will be awarded within sixty (60) days, Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded, after the opening of bids.

All bids must be submitted in the manner and form prescribed by the IFB which controls award of the contract. All bids are subject to the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 149, §§44A-44J.

All bids shall be submitted as one (1) ORIGINAL and two (2) COPIES, plus one (1) digital copy.

All City bids are available on the City's web site at www.newtonma.gov/bids. It is the sole responsibility of the contractor downloading these bids to ensure they have received any and all addenda prior to the bid opening. Addenda will be available online within the original bid document as well as a separate file. If you download bids from the internet site and would like to make it known that your company has done so, you may fax the Purchasing Department (617) 796-1227 or email to purchasing@newtonma.gov with your NAME, ADDRESS, PHONE, FAX AND INVITATION FOR BID NUMBER.

The City will reject any and all bids in accordance with the above referenced General Laws. In addition, the City reserves the right to waive minor informalities in any or all bids, or to reject any or all bids (in whole or in part) if it be in the public interest to do so.

SUPPLY & INSTALL FURNITURE, FIXTURES AND EQUIPMENT INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

The City of Newton, MA, the City (City), invites sealed bids for the supply and installation of furnishings, fixtures and equipment (FFE) for the Newton Early Childhood Program, 687 Watertown Street, Newton, MA 02460 (School).

The City has undertaken a renovation of the School, including the construction of additions. Construction is currently underway and is expected to be completed by November 25, 2022. The construction is being overseen by the City's Owner's Project Manager, Vivian Varbedian, Hill International Inc. (OPM). The School's FFE must be ready for delivery and installation in time for the opening of the January 2023 academic semester. Delivery and installation are to occur between November 28, 2022 and December 9, 2022; confirmation of the exact delivery and installation time duration will be confirmed as the date approaches. The FFE supply and installation is being overseen by the City's Furniture/Equipment Consultant, Todd Tsiang (FFE Consultant). Time is of the essence in the performance of the contract entered into pursuant to this IFB,

ARTICLE 1 - BIDDER'S REPRESENTATION

- 1.1 Each General Bidder (hereinafter called the "Bidder") by making a bid (hereinafter called "bid") represents that:
 - 1. The Bidder has read and understands the Bidding Documents, Contract Forms, General Conditions, Conditions of the Contract, General Requirements and Project Specifications (collectively, referred to as the "Contract Documents") and the bid is made in accordance therewith.
 - 2. The Bidder has been given the opportunity to visit the work sites and is familiar with the local conditions under which the work has to be performed.
- 1.2 Failure to so examine the Contract Documents or visit the work sites will not relieve any Bidder from any obligation under the bid as submitted.

ARTICLE 2 - REQUEST FOR INTERPRETATION

- 2.1 Bidders shall promptly notify the City of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or error which they may discover upon examination of the Contract Documents, the site, and local conditions.
- 2.2 Bidders requiring clarification or interpretation of the Contract Documents shall make a written request to the *Chief Procurement Officer*, at purchasing@newtonma.gov or via facsimile (617) 796-1227. The City will only answer such requests if received by **Friday**, **June 24**, **2022 at 12:00 noon**. In the event that the bid opening date is changed, the deadline for informational requests may also change as provided in an addendum issued by the City.
- 2.3 Interpretation, correction, or change in the Contract Documents will be made by addendum which will become part of the Contract Documents. The City will not be held accountable for any oral communication.
- 2.4 Addenda will be emailed to every individual or firm on record as having taken a set of Contract Documents. Receipt of all addenda issued must be acknowledged in the Bid Form. YOUR FAILURE TO ACKNOWLEDGE ALL ADDENDA MAY RESULT IN YOUR BID BEING REJECTED AS NON-RESPONSIVE.
- 2.5 Copies of addenda will be made available for inspection at the location listed in the Invitation for Bids where Contract Documents are on file, in addition to being available online at www.newtonma.gov/bids.
- 2.6 Bidders or proposers contacting ANY CITY EMPLOYEE regarding an Invitation for Bid (IFB) or a Request for Proposal (RFP), outside of the Purchasing Department, once an IFB or RFP has been released, may be disqualified from the procurement process.
- Bidders downloading information off the internet web site are solely responsible for obtaining any addenda prior to the bid opening. If the bidder makes itself known to the Purchasing Department, at purchasing@newtonma.gov or via facsimile (617) 796-1227, it shall be placed on the bidder's list. Bidders must provide the Purchasing Department with their company's name, street address, city, state, zip, phone, fax, email address and INVITATION FOR BID #22-98.

ARTICLE 3 - MBE PARTICIPATION

- 3.1 Notice is hereby given that the Mayor's Affirmative Action Plan for the City of Newton in effect at the time of this solicitation is applicable to all construction contracts in excess of \$10,000.00.
- 3.2 Notice is hereby given that the City of Newton Minority/Women Business Enterprise Plan and the Supplemental Equal Employment Opportunity Anti-Discrimination and Affirmative Action Program in effect at the time of this solicitation are applicable to all City contracts for goods and services in excess of \$50,000.00.
- 3.3 Copies of the Plans and Program referred to in Sections 3.1 and 3.2 are available at: www.newtonma.gov/purchasing.

ARTICLE 4 - PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 4.1 Bids shall be submitted on the "Form of General Bid #22-98," attached.
- 4.2 All entries on the Bid Form shall be made by typewriter or in ink.
- 4.3 Where so indicated on the Bid Form, sums shall be expressed in both words and figures. Where there is a discrepancy between the bid sum expressed in words and the bid sum expressed in figures, the words shall control.
- 4.4 Bid Deposits shall be submitted in the amount specified in the Invitation for Bids. They shall be made payable to the City and shall be either in the form of cash, certified check, treasurer's or cashier's check issued by a responsible bank or trust company, or a bid bond issued by a surety licensed to do business in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and shall be conditioned upon the faithful performance by the principal of the agreements contained in the bid. Bidders are reminded that the bid deposit covers the City for damages when a bidder withdraws its bid after the bid submisssion date. **Be** advised that to the extent permitted by the law the City will retain all bid deposits for withdrawn bids.

Bid deposits of the three (3) lowest responsible and eligible Bidders shall be retained until the execution and delivery of the City-Contractor agreement.

- 4.5 The Bid, including the bid deposit shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope with the following plainly marked on the outside:
 - * GENERAL BID FOR : #22-98
 - * NAME OF PROJECT: Supply & Install Furniture, Fixtures And Equipment to Newton Early Childhood Program
 - * BIDDER'S NAME, BUSINESS ADDRESS, AND PHONE NUMBER
- 4.6 Date and time for receipt of bids is set forth in the Invitation for Bids.
- 4.7 Timely delivery of a bid at the location designated shall be the full responsibility of the Bidder. In the event That Newton City Hall is closed on the date or at the time that bids are due, the date and time for receipt of bids shall be on the next business day following that the Newton City Hall and the Purchasing Department are open.
- 4.8 Bids shall be submitted with one **original** and one **copy.**
- 4.9 Massachusetts law requires all employees who work on Massachusetts public works construction sites must have no Less than 10 hours of OSHA-approved safety and health training. See M.G.L. c.30, §39M(c), M.G.L. c.30, §39S(a)(1), M.G.L. c.149, §44E(2) & M.G.L. c.149, §44F(2).
 - 1. This requirement will apply to any general bid or sub bid submitted.
 - 2. This law directs the Massachusetts Attorney General to restrain the award of construction contracts to any contractor who is in violation to this requirement and to restrain the performance of these contracts by non-complying contractors.
 - 3. The contractor and all subcontractors on this project must certify on the Bid Form compliance with the applicable requirement. Non-compliance with this law will disqualify the bidder..

ARTICLE 5 - ALTERNATES

- 5.1 Each Bidder shall acknowledge alternates (if any) in Section C on the Bid Form.
- In the event an alternate does not involve a change in the amount of the base bid, the Bidder shall so indicated by writing "No Change", or "N/C" or "0" in the space provided for that alternate.
- 5.3 Bidders shall enter on the Bid Form a single amount for each alternate which shall consist of the amount for work performed by the Contractor.
- 5.4 The low Bidder will be determined on the basis of the sum of the base bid and the accepted alternates.

ARTICLE 6 - WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

- Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the time designated for receipt of bids on written or electronic request. Electronic withdrawal of bids must be confirmed over the Bidder's signature by written notice postmarked on or before the date and time set for receipt of bids.
- 6.2 Withdrawn bids may be resubmitted up to the time designated for the receipt of bids.
- 6.3 No bids may be withdrawn within sixty (60) days, Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after the opening of the bids.

ARTICLE 7 - CONTRACT AWARD

- 7. 1 The City is soliciting prices for each item listed in Attachment A, Technical Specifications. Bidders shall provide prices for a few as one or as many as all such items on Bid Lists 1 and 2. Each item unit cost must include all freight, delivery, assembly, installation and labor required. The City will award a bid for an item to the responsible and eligible bidder submitting the lowest price for that item. Accordingly, the City will accept bids for as few as one or as many as all of the items in Attachment A and multiple awards may occur under this IFB. Contracts will be awarded within sixty (60) days, Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded, after the opening of bids.
- 7.2 The City reserves the right to waive minor informalities in or to reject any or all Bids if it be in the public interest to do so.
- 7.3 The City reserves the right to reject any bidder who has failed to pay any local taxes, fees, assessments, betterments, or any other municipal charge, unless the bidder has a pending abatement application or has entered into a payment agreement with the collector-treasurer.
- 7.5 As used herein, the term "lowest responsible and eligible Bidder" shall mean the Bidder (1) whose bid is the lowest of those bidders possessing the skill, ability and integrity necessary for the faithful performance of the work; (2) who has met all the requirements of the invitation for bids; (3) who shall certify that he is able to furnish labor that can work in harmony with all other elements of labor employed or to be employed in the work; (4) who, where the provisions of section eight B of chapter twenty-nine apply, shall have been determined to be qualified thereunder.
- Subsequent to the award and within five (5) days, Saturday, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after the prescribed forms are presented for signature, the successful Bidder shall execute and deliver to the City a contract in the form included in the Contract Documents in such number of counterparts as the City may require.
- 7.7 In the event that the City receives low bids in identical amount from two or more responsive and responsible Bidders, the City shall select the successful Bidder by a blind selection process chosen by the City such as flipping a coin or drawing names from a hat. The low Bidders who are under consideration will be invited to attend and observe the selection process.

ARTICLE 8 - TAXES

8.1 The Bidder shall not include in this bid any tax imposed upon the sale or rental of tangible personal property in this Commonwealth, such as any and all building materials, supplies, services and equipment required to complete the work.

8.2 The City is exempt from payment of the Massachusetts Sales Tax, and the Bidder shall not include any sales tax on its bid. The City's exemption Number is E-046-001-404.

ARTICLE 9 – PROPRIETARY SPECIFICATIONS

9.1 The City has used a proprietary specification to describe the supply listed in the specifications. Such specifications are permitted under M.G.L. c. 30, §39M(b), provided that the City states in writing that use of the proprietary specification is in its best interest and that it will accept an "equal" of the item specified. An item is considered equal if (i) it is at least equal in quality, durability, appearance, strength, and design; (ii) will perform the intended function at least equally; and (iii) conforms substantially, even with deviations, to the detailed requirements contained in the specifications. In the event that the Bidder wishes to substitute an equal item, it may do so either in its bid or proposal or after the contract is awarded but before a contract is executed, it being understood that the award shall be conditioned on the Bidder providing the item originally specified or an equal item accepted by the City and identified in the contract.

In no event shall the Bidder be entitled to offer, or the City obliged to consider, the substitution of an item as equal after execution of a contract. In the event the Bidder substitutes or attempts to substitute an "equal" item after that date, it shall be in breach thereof and be liable for actual and consequential damages resulting from its failure to perform as agreed. The City shall have the sole right to determine whether or not said item is equal.

9.2 The required determination and justification have been duly prepared, and a copy may be requested in accordance with the Massachusetts Public Records Law, M.G.L. c. 66, §10.

ARTICLE 10 – EXPLANATION OF REQUIREMENTS IN TECHNICAL SECTIONS

- 10.1. Bidders shall refer to the number coded items 1 is ted in the Technical Specifications attached hereto as Attachment A, designed to provide each Bidder with a clear understanding of the requirements it must meet. These serve to establish specifically the standard of quality, function and performance of the items to be furnished, and do this by referring to representative manufacturers and detailed specifications. Unless specifically provided to the contrary, the words "or approved equal" in accordance with Chapter 30, §39M, shall be deemed to follow the naming or description of each product, material or component part thereof named or described in each sub-section. See Article 11, "Samples", for treatment of equals.
- 10.2. The intent of the IFB is to secure a range of furnishings, necessarily obtained from different suppliers and composed of the work of many different manufacturers, which harmonize not only in function and dimension, but also in appearance. The prime method for obtaining this harmony is through the use of color and finishes. Therefore, as part of the general design, all items, whether named or bid as alternatives, must comply with the overall requirement of color harmony. All color and finish within any single technical section may be required to match exactly. Color and finish on items to be located in adjacent spaces or within the same space may be required to match exactly if so indicated in their respective color and finish description. In general, the Furniture/Equipment Consultant will require reasonable compliance by all bidders to the stated colors and in so doing will not necessarily be bound by any so-called "standard" or "special" color lists in satisfaction of this requirement. Any bidder seeking to furnish an item not embodying the exact color or finish specified in the Documents must submit their proposed color range to the Furniture/Equipment Consultant for approval under Paragraph 11, "Samples". Any item for which colors have not been so submitted and approved will be assumed by the Furniture/Equipment Consultant to be supplied in the specified colors and finishes.
- 10.3. Special Requirements or product modifications may appear in any technical section for which specific requirements or added information is required; when present in such a section, the Bidder will be held to conformance therein.
- 10.4. The Item Code designations in the specifications and on the plans are provided as an aid to successful bidders.

ARTICLE 11 - SAMPLES

11.1. Samples may be required from any bidder proposing an item other than the item specified in the Bid Documents. Each Bidder proposing such an alternate shall be prepared to submit samples of all alternate items on which his proposal has been based, within five (5) days, Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays excluded, after receipt of bid from the Furniture/Equipment Consultant. To facilitate comparison and evaluation of alternates, the Furniture/Equipment Consultant may also request an example of the item named as a reference in the specification. Failure to provide samples as described herein within the time required will result in award to next

lowest bidder.

11.2. Alternate items to those actually named or specified in the Bid Documents will be considered for approval as equals by

the Furniture/Equipment Consultant only upon receipt of the following by the Furniture/Equipment Consultant at the location and within the time period designated by the Furniture/Equipment Consultant:

11.2.1. One (1) truly representative sample of each item requested by the Furniture/Equipment Consultant, complete in every respect, with regard to materials, gauges, thickness, finishes, and construction. No future compliance assertions to the Bid Documents, or "can do" provisions, made by the Bidder, will be accepted as consideration for approval as an equal, without specific written approval of the Furniture/Equipment Consultant and City.

Note: Technical Specifications and drawings indicating details of construction, catalog descriptions and brochures may not be accepted as sole compliance with this requirement.

11.2.2. Samples of the actual color and finishes as required under each Section integrally a part of or applied to the actual

materials proposed for use under this Contract.

11.2.3. Manufacturer's printed methods and materials recommended for the cleaning and maintenance of each surface.

A list of forbidden practices and typical cleaning agents which would cause manufacturer to request voiding of the guarantee.

11.3. All samples must be securely labeled with the name of the project and the following items:

- 11.4. All charges in connection with the delivery and retrieval of samples shall be borne by the respective potential bidders.
- 11.5. The materials and/or equipment furnished under the Contact shall in all respects be equal in quality the samples submitted to and approved by the Furniture/Equipment Consultant and/or City.
- 11.6. If requested by vendor, samples will be returned if costs to return are prepaid by vendor.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. THE OWNER

The City is represented by and acting through its OPM.

2. THE FURNITURE/EQUIPMENT CONSULTANT

2.1. The Furniture/Equipment Consultant and shall be the representative of the Owner during the Contract period and shall observe the work in progress on behalf of the Owner. He shall be the interpreter of the Contract Documents; he shall have the authority to reject non-conforming work. He shall evaluate the Contractor's applications for payment make recommendations to the committee and confirm the date of final completion of the work.

3. THE CONTRACTOR

- 3.1. The Contractor is the individual owner, partnership, or corporation including all authorized representatives of such mentioned in the Contract executed pursuant to this IFB (Contract), performing the work as described in the Contract.
- 3.2. The Contractor shall perform all work, including the furnishing of all material, labor, equipment, supplies, plants, tools, transportation, cartage of every description, superintendent, insurance, taxes, licenses and fees, installation of furnishings and equipment, and other services necessary for compliance with the Contract Documents
- 3.3. The Contractor shall obtain and pay for all permits and licenses of a temporary nature necessary for the performance of work.
- 3.4. The Contractor shall give all notices and comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations relating to the conduct of the work as planned and specified.
- 3.5. If the Contractor observes that the Drawings and Specifications are ambiguous or at variance with each other, they shall promptly notify the Furniture/Equipment Consultant.
- 3.6. The Contractor shall furnish such bonds as are called for in the Invitation to Bid and Instructions to Bidders.
- 3.7. Before executing contract work, the Contractor shall furnish to the Owner satisfactory proof that they have taken out and is maintaining all the insurance required hereunder.
- 3.8. The Contractor agrees that they are fully responsible to the Owner for the acts and omissions of their Subcontractors, if any, and of persons employed by them, as they are for the acts and omissions of persons employed by them.

4. SEPARATE CONTRACTS/COORDINATION WITH SCHOOL OPERATIONS

If any part of the Contractor's work depends for proper execution or result upon the work of any other contractor, the Contractor shall inspect and promptly report to the Owner any defects in such work that renders it unsuitable for such proper execution and results. Failure to so inspect and report shall constitute acceptance of the other contractor's work except where defects develop in the other contractor's work after the execution of the Contractor's work. The Contractor shall coordinate their work and cooperate with other contractors.

5. PROTECTION OF WORK AND PROPERTY

- 5.1. The Contractor shall bear all risks of loss or of damage to all material, moveable furnishings and equipment to be provided by them hereunder until delivered to the appropriate building and placed in designated areas, unless otherwise agreed to by the Owner in writing.
- 5.2. The Contractor shall take all proper precautions to protect persons and existing property from injury, unnecessary interference or inconvenience and shall be responsible for the results of any failure in doing so.
- 5.3. The Contractor shall bear entire responsibility for the proper layout of their work and any damage, which they may cause to occur by any act or omission on their part.
- 5.4. The Contractor shall protect any staging area where they are assembling with 6 mil. poly and ½" Masonite or other alternative protective materials as approved by the Owner.

6. TIME

- 6.1. All time limits stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence to the Contract.
- 6.2. If the Contractor is delayed in the prosecution or completion of the work by any damage caused by fire, war, embargoes, Acts of God, general strikes or lock-outs caused by acts of employees, adverse weather conditions not reasonably anticipated, or by delay caused by the Owner or the other contractors hired by the Owner, or other casualty for which the Contractor is not responsible, they shall be allowed such extension of time with no increase in price, for completion of the work. The Owner shall determine to be just. No extension of time for the completion of the work for any cause mentioned in this article shall be made unless a claim for extension of time is presented, in writing, to the Owner within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of such cause. Such extension of contract time shall be the Contractor's sole remedy in the event of delay.

7. REIMBURSEMENT TO THE OWNER FOR LOSS

7.1. If the Contractor delays the progress of any work let by the Owner under a separate contract, apart from this Contract, so as to cause loss for which the Owner becomes liable, then they shall reimburse the Owner for such loss, in such sums as the Owner shall determine to be just.

8. GUARANTEE

8.1. In consideration of the execution of this Contract by the Owner and the price herein stipulated to be paid and received for the work, the Contractor hereby binds and obligates themself and does hereby agree to bring all portions of the work under this Contract to entire completion free of all defects of material or workmanship and guarantees that the said work shall remain free of all defects of material and workmanship for a period of one (1) year from the date of final payment for the work, and also guarantees on written notice from the Owner to forthwith repair, and make good or cause to be repaired and made good, at their own expense and to the satisfaction of the Owner, all defects of material or workmanship in the said work and to pay for or cause to be paid for any damage to other work resulting therefrom, which may develop during the period of one (1) year from the date of final payment for the work under this Contract. 9.1. The Furniture/Equipment Consultant will furnish, free of charge, one complete set of electronic Drawings and Specifications to the contractor for the execution of the work.

10. EXAMINATION OF PREMISES AND CONDITIONS AFFECTING THE WORK

- 10.1. It is agreed and understood that the Contractor has examined the premises and is satisfied as to the existing conditions under which they will be obliged to operate in performing the work.
- 10.2. The Contractor shall not enter or have access to any space in the building in order to perform the work without first having given timely notice to the Owner so that the necessary arrangements may be made. In the performance of the work, the Contractor shall at all times furnish and maintain proper protection for the floors, walls, ceilings, fixtures, equipment, furniture, and/or other property of the Owner.

11. OBTAINING AND STUDY OF INSTRUCTIONS

11.1. The Contractor shall carefully study all specifications, drawings and other instructions from the Owner as they are delivered and procure from the Owner or the Furniture/Equipment Consultant such special information, detailed drawings, etc., as may be necessary for the proper performance of the work.

12. QUALITY OF THE WORK

12.1. The Contractor shall carry out the work with due diligence and dispatch. Reused or refurbished items will not be accepted.

13. MATERIALS

They shall conform to all requirements of law and all other public authorities, state or local, relating to the methods or materials to be used, or to the persons to be employed in doing the work. They shall indemnify and hold the Owner, the Furniture/Equipment Consultant, their agents and employees harmless from and against any and all claims, liability, and damages of every nature and description (including attorney's fees) related to the performance of the work which they may suffer provided that such claim, liability or damage is caused in whole or in part by any negligent act or omission of the Contractor, their agents or employees, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable.

24. CORRECTION OF DAMAGES AND FINAL CLEANING

- 24.1. The Contractor shall be fully responsible for the following performed at their own expense, and to the satisfaction of the Owner:
- 24.2. Repairing, replacing and/or otherwise correcting damages and flaws to items furnished by the Contractor.
- 24.3. Repairing, replacing and/or otherwise correcting damages and flaws to other areas caused by work performed by the Contractor.
- 24.4. Performing final cleaning, upon completion of the Contractor's work.
- 24.5. The Owner reserves the right, after giving seventy-two hours' notice thereof to the Contractor, to have such defective work corrected, or to perform such cleaning, and to deduct the cost thereof from the sums otherwise due the Contractor.

25. COMMENCEMENT AND COMPLETION OF THE WORK

- 25.1. The work to be performed under this contract shall be commenced upon receipt by the Owner of the signed contract; all requisite bonds, certificates of insurance and other such items as may be required by the Contract Documents.
- 25.2. It is anticipated that the building to receive items contained within this Contract will be available for delivery and installation on or about Monday, November 28, 2022, provided, however, that the Contractor shall adjust its delivery and installation for a later date as necessary based on the availability of the building to receive the items contained within this Contract. The Contractor must submit a delivery and installation schedule to the Owner for the Owner's approval, providing for delivery and installation between the dates that the building is first available for receipt and the Contract Completion date. It is understood that the Contractor will need to coordinate its delivery and installation schedule with building availability and with other vendors and/or contractors. If delivery and installation occurs without written notification to the Owner, the Owner reserves the right to refuse delivery and installation of such item(s) until such time written notification is provided by the Contractor.
- 25.3. In no case shall installation of FURNITURE and EQUIPMENT occur later than the Contract Completion Friday, 9 December 2022. Completion of the work shall mean on site delivered and installed as specifically described in the Contract Documents.

26. PAYMENT

26.1. When the Contractor has completed all of the work of any item, they shall submit a request for payment along with any supporting documentation required by the Owner to the Consultant. Thereafter the Consultant shall make an inspection of all items and work and shall forward to the Owner, a recommendation for payment based upon that inspection. The results of the inspection shall also be made known to the Contractor. Upon final completion, the Consultant will recommend to the Owner 100% payment provided that the Contract has been fully performed to the satisfaction of the Consultant and the Owner; for partial completion, an appropriately lesser amount may be recommended. Following receipt of the Contractor's request for payment and the Consultant's recommendation, the Owner shall make appropriate payment to the Contractor.

27. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS

27.1. Nothing in this Contract shall be deemed to commit the Owner to pay any sum in excess of monies lawfully appropriated or available to the Owner for the purposes described in this Contract.

28. TERMINATION BY THE CONTRACTOR

28.1. If the Furniture/Equipment Consultant fails to certify payment for a period of thirty (30) days after request of the Contractor, through no fault of the Contractor, or if the Owner fails to make payment thereon for a period of sixty (60) days or as otherwise specified, then the Contractor may, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Owner, terminate the Contract and recover from the Owner payment for all Work executed and for any proven loss sustained upon the materials and/or equipment, including reasonable profit and damages.

29. TERMINATION BY THE OWNER

29.1. If the Contractor defaults or neglects to carry out the Work in conformance with the Contract Documents or fails to perform any provisions of the Contract, the Owner may, after seven (7) days written notice to the Contractor and without prejudice to any other remedy they may have, make good such deficiencies and may deduct the cost thereof from the payment then or thereafter due the Contractor or, at their option, may terminate the Contract and take possession of the site and of all material, equipment, tools, and construction equipment and machinery thereon owned by the Contractor and may finish the Work by whatever method they may deem expedient, and if the unpaid balance of the Contract Sum exceeds the expense of finishing the Work, such excess shall be paid to the Contractor, but if such expense exceeds such unpaid balance, the Contractor shall pay the difference to the Owner.

30. ASSIGNMENTS

30.1. Neither party to the Contract shall assign or sublet the Contract without the written consent of the other; nor shall the Contractor assign any monies due them without the written consent of the Owner.

31. AMENDMENTS

31.1. This Contract represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties hereto and supersedes all prior negotiation, representations or agreements, either written or oral. The Contract may be amended or modified only by a written amendment signed by the Contractor and by an official of the Owner having authority to bind the Owner.

32. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

32.1. Any activity by the Contractor, their agents or employees that would constitute a violation of the conflict of interest statute, M.G.L. Chapter 268A, is hereby prohibited and shall constitute a material breach of the Contract.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. LOCATION

1.1. The work is to be performed at the Newton Early Childhood Program, 687 Watertown Street, Newton, MA 02060

2. SCHEDULE FOR PERFORMANCE OF THE WORK

- 2.1. The items to be provided under the contract shall be delivered and installed, as stated in the Contract, Article 3. Please note that individual items may require more than one delivery to the same location.
- 2.2. At the request of the Furniture/Equipment Consultant and no later than 30 days before the commencement of the installation period, the Contractor shall submit their detailed schedule for delivery and installation of the work.
- 2.3. The Contractor shall submit all samples, furnishings, shop drawings, and mock-ups to the Furniture/Equipment Consultant as required by their particular items and the Contract Documents. They shall submit a copy of manufacturers' acknowledgments for each item. All submissions shall be complete within two calendar months after receipt of Contract.

3. DEFINITION OF INSTALLATION, OWNERSHIP

- 3.1. Installation shall have occurred when the Contractor has performed the following to the satisfaction of the Owner and as approved by the Furniture/Equipment Consultant. Final installation is to be reviewed by the manufacturer's representative and/or sales representative with written documentation to be submitted to the Owner stating compliance with the following:
- 3.1.1. Each and every item comprising the work has been furnished complete and as described in the Contract Documents.
- 3.1.2. The material is located, attached, connected and/or otherwise in-place as shown on the Drawings or indicated in the Specifications. Installation layouts will be posted at each room during installation and distribution schedules will be forwarded to awarded vendors prior to installation.
- 3.1.3. The material is clean and polished, and the area is free from packing as required by the General Conditions.
- 3.1.4. Guarantees, maintenance manuals, keys and other loose items have been delivered to the Owner.
- 3.1.5. Any required instruction to the Owner has been satisfactorily given.
- 3.2. The Contractor shall receive all materials at the site. The Contractor shall be responsible for determining whether the quantities claimed have been delivered, and whether there is no apparent damage. The Owner reserves the right to refuse delivery of any shipment if it arrives in the absence of the Contractor or arrives on a date(s) not previously scheduled with the Owner or Furniture/Equipment Consultant. Such shipments shall include, but will not be limited to, third party trucking companies, and shipments direct from the manufacturer. Please be aware that no general UPS/FedEx or common carrier deliveries will be allowed unless a vendor's representative is on-site to meet the trucks and to oversee the full inside deliver, assembly and placement of items. No sidewalk deliveries will be accepted. Final delivery schedule to be coordinated with the Furniture and Equipment consultant.
- 3.3. The Contractor shall submit to the Furniture/Equipment Consultant all packing slips/delivery receipts listing all items and quantities received for the project. <u>Invoices for the delivered and installed items will not be processed without this proof of delivery.</u>
- 3.4. The Contractor's installation of the materials must take place within the times approved by the Owner and the Furniture/Equipment Consultant and in accordance with Section 5 below.
- 3.5. If the Contractor obtains early delivery of materials (prior to the scheduled installation period) they shall be entirely responsible for the receiving, handling, storage and final delivery of the materials, including warehousing as may be necessary until the start of the installation period. They shall make their own arrangement with all parties concerned in this regard.

3.6. If the Owner cannot make the premises available for final installation as shown on the drawings at the time scheduled for the installation period, they shall give timely notice to the Contractor. The Contractor, at their option, may choose to make their own temporary storage arrangements or may use a space provided at the project if available for the temporary storage of their material.

In such cases the Owner will endeavor to protect material; however, the Owner shall not be liable for damages incurred during this period. The Owner will make appropriate partial payment up to but not exceeding 75% of the contract value of the delivered item, during this period for material if stored on their premises and will give timely notice of the readiness of the premises for final installation. By such storage and/or partial payment the Owner shall not be deemed to have accepted nor shall the Contractor be deemed to have installed the material.

- 3.7. The Owner's acceptance shall take place upon final installation and completion of the work to the Owner's satisfaction in accordance with the Contract Documents. For insurance and other purposes, however, the Owner's interest shall be in direct relation to the amount of partial payment made upon the account.
- 3.8. If any work which has been previously accepted, specifically or by the making of payment, is found to have defects, damage, or deficiencies, or fails to conform to the Contract Documents, the Owner may revoke acceptance. Such revocation shall be made by giving prompt notice to the Contractor, and the Contractor shall promptly remedy the same at their own expense.
- 3.9. If the Contractor is required to perform work to remedy defects, damage or deficiencies after December 31, 2022, CORI Forms and checks will be required prior to the Contractor coming onto the site/premises.

4. OWNER'S REMEDY FOR DELAY

4.1. It is understood and agreed that time is of the essence of this Contract. If the Contractor fails to achieve final completion of any portion of the work by the applicable Contract Completion Date, the Owner shall, without prejudice to any other remedy the Owner may have, require that the Contractor supply similar items deemed suitable by the Owner on a temporary basis for the intended use.

These items must be placed in accordance with the Contract Documents and removed by the Contractor at the time of installation of the actual items purchased. Such temporary furnishings or equipment must be installed in conformance with the scheduled completion dates set forth in the contract at no cost to the owner.

- 4.2. As an alternative remedy to paragraph 4.1 the Owner may assess liquidated damages in the amount of \$200.00 dollars per day for each day after the Contractor has failed to complete its work.
- 4.3. The whole or any part of said remedy for delay may be waived by the Owner in writing at the Owner's sole discretion if the Owner determines the operation of the school will not be affected by the absence of such furnishings.

5. HOURS OF WORK

- 5.1. The Contractor shall furnish sufficient forces to insure the prosecution of work in accordance with the schedule. If the installation of the material is not complete by the appropriate Contract completion date, then the Contractor shall, at the Owner's request, carry out all remaining installation work outside school hours, at no extra cost to the Owner, so as to avoid disturbing normal school activities.
- 5.2. Subject to 5.1 above, work shall be performed during normal working hours, starting no sooner than 7:00AM, weekdays or 8:00AM on Saturday, except work may be performed on night shifts, overtime, Sundays and holidays when permission to do so has been obtained from the Owner.
- 5.3. The Contractor will not be entitled to additional compensation for extra shifts or overtime work required to perform the work unless the Owner specifically agrees to assume such payment obligation in advance of authorizing such additional compensation.

6. FIRE RESISTANCE

6.1. Applicable regulations: All items furnished shall comply with the current requirements of 527 CMR 21.00 "Flammable Decorations" and 527 CMR 29.00 "Upholstered Furniture", which is part of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Department of Public Safety Board of Fire Prevention Regulations 527 CMR 1.00- 50.00 dated December 31, 2014, and as amended.

7. MAINTENANCE INSTRUCTIONS

7.1. The Contractor must supply the Owner with satisfactory instructions on the proper maintenance of all items covered in this Contract.

8. LEED SCHOOL

8.1. This project shall be a LEED School. Contractor shall provide any/all information regarding Certified products, as requested to Owner.

9. MANUFACTURERS' WARRANTIES

9.1. In addition to the guarantee requirement of the General Conditions, certain equipment is warranted to the original purchaser for longer periods to be free from defects in material and workmanship. In order for the Owner to benefit from such warranties, the Contractor shall forward copies of the manufacturer's standard warranty forms to the Owner as a condition of the Owner's final acceptance of such equipment.

10. SHOP DRAWINGS

10.1. Where required in the specifications, shop drawings shall be submitted. All drawings shall be at minimum 1/4" scale giving accurate as-built conditions where relevant, accurate rough-in dimensions and exact indication of connections to all services. The Contractor must supply detailed specification information as requested, must submit three sets of prints for each shop drawing to the Furniture/Equipment Consultant, and shall begin no affected portions of the work before approval of shop drawings.

11. PROJECT COMMUNICATION

11.1. Communication between the Contractor shall be through the Furniture/Equipment Consultant, as the representative of the Owner during the Contract period. The Contractor shall make no direct communication with the Owner without first notifying the Furniture/Equipment Consultant. If, in any circumstance, such direct communication occurs, it is to be made in writing with a copy sent simultaneously to the Furniture/Equipment Consultant.

The parties hereto for the considerations hereinafter set forth agree as follows:

I. SCOPE OF WORK. The Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment, and perform all work required in strict accordance with the Contract Documents for the following project:

Supply & Install Furniture, Fixtures and Equipment to Newton Early Childhood Program

- **II. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.** The Contract documents consist of the following documents which are either attached to this Agreement or are incorporated herein by referenced:
 - a. This CITY-CONTRACTOR Agreement;
 - b. The City's Invitation For Bid #22-98 issued by the Purchasing Department;
 - c. The Project Manual for Supply & Install Furniture, Fixtures and Equipment Newton Early Childhood Program, including the Instructions to Bidders; Project Drawings and Technical Specifications; General Conditions; Special Conditions; MWBE/AA Requirements, Wage Rate Requirements and Wage Rate Schedule(s) including any updated prevailing wage rate schedules if applicable; Supplementary Special Conditions; General Requirements and Project Specifications; and Drawings, if included or referenced therein;
 - d. Addenda Number(s) _____;
 - e. The Bid Response of the CONTRACTOR submitted for this Project and accompanying documents and certifications;
 - f. Certificate(s) of Insurance and surety bond(s) submitted by the CONTRACTOR in connection with this Project; and
 - g. Duly authorized and executed Amendments, Change Orders or Purchase orders issued by the CITY after execution of this CITY-CONTRACTOR Agreement.

This CITY-CONTRACTOR Agreement, together with the other documents enumerated in this Article, constitute the entire Agreement between the CITY and the CONTRACTOR. The CONTRACTOR represents that its bid was made without condition, qualification or reservation of any kind, except upon the written acknowledgement and consent of the CITY.

- **III. PRIORITY OF DOCUMENTS.** In the event of inconsistency between the terms of this CITY -CONTRACTOR Agreement and the Project Manual, the terms of this Agreement shall prevail.
- **IV. APPLICABLE STATUTES.** All applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations are incorporated herein by reference and the Contractor agrees to comply with same.
- V. CONTRACT TERM. The term of this contract shall extend from the date of contract execution until December 9, 2022, or until such later date as may be agreed by the parties.
- VI. AUTHORIZATION OF AND PAYMENT FOR WORK PERFORMED. The execution of this contract does not constitute a notice to proceed or authorization to perform work. No work shall be commenced unless authorized by a written Work Order prepared by City of Newton Public Buildings Department specifying the work to be performed. The Contractor will be paid following completion and acceptance of the work authorized in accordance with the Contract. The City will use best efforts to pay within thirty (30) days of receipt of an invoice for the work authorized or acceptance of the work whichever date is later.

- VII. RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE WORK/INDEMNIFICATION. The Contractor shall take all responsibility for the work, and shall take all precautions for preventing injuries to persons and property in or about the work and shall defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from all loss, cost, damage or expense arising from injuries to persons or property in or about the work. The Contractor shall be responsible for any damage which may be caused by the failure or insufficiency of any temporary works. He shall effectively protect his work and shall be liable for all damage and loss by delay or otherwise caused by his neglect or failure so to do.
- VIII. WARRANTY. Except as may be otherwise provided in the Project Manual, the Contractor shall replace, repair or make good, without cost to the City, any defects or faults arising within one (1) year after date of acceptance of work and materials furnished hereunder (acceptance not to be unreasonably delayed) resulting from imperfect or defective work done or materials furnished by the Contractor.
- IX. PATENT INDEMNIFICATION. The Contractor agrees to assume the defense of and shall indemnify and save harmless the City and all persons acting for or on behalf of it from all suits and claims against them, or any of them, arising from or occasioned by the use of any material, equipment or apparatus, or any part thereof which infringes or is alleged to infringe on any patent rights. In case such material, equipment or apparatus, or any part thereof, in any such suit is held to constitute infringement, the Contractor, within a reasonable time, shall at its own expense, and as the City may elect, replace such material, equipment or apparatus with non-infringing material, equipment or apparatus, or remove the material, equipment, or apparatus and refund the sums paid therefor.
- **X. ASSIGNMENT/SUB-CONTRACTING.** The Contractor agrees that he will not sell, assign or transfer this Contract or any part thereof or interest therein without the prior written consent of the City.
- XI. TERMINATION. If the work to be done under this Contract shall be abandoned, or if this Contract or any part thereof shall be assigned or transferred, without the previous written consent of the City, or if the Contract or any claim hereunder shall be assigned by the Contractor otherwise than as herein specified, or if at any time the City determines that the conditions herein specified as to the rate of progress are not fulfilled, or that the work or any part thereof, is unnecessarily or unreasonably delayed, or that the Contractor has violated any of the provisions of this Contract, the City may terminate this Contract and/or notify the Contractor to discontinue such work or such part thereof as the City may designate, and the City may thereupon by agreement or otherwise, as it may determine, complete the work, or any part thereof; and for such completion the City for itself or for its Contractor may take possession of and use or cause to be used in the completion of the work thereof any of such materials, apparatus, machinery, implements, and tools of every description as may be found upon said work. Termination pursuant to this paragraph shall not entitle the Contractor to any claim for damages on account thereof, nor shall it relieve the Contractor of any liability under this Contract.

WAGE RATE REQUIREMENTS

1. GENERAL

- A. This section summarizes the requirements for the payment of wages to laborers and mechanics employed under the Contract.
- **B**. Other duties and requirements of law which may not be specified in this section apply and are inherently a part of the Contract.

2. WAGE RATES

- A. The rate per hour to be paid to mechanics, apprentices, teamsters, chauffeurs, and laborers employed on the Work shall not be less than the rate of wages in the attached "Minimum Wage Rates" as determined by the Commissioner of Labor and Industries. This schedule shall continue to be the minimum rate of wages for said employees during the life of this Contract.
- **B.** Keep posted on the site a legible copy of said schedule. Keep on file the wage rates and classifications of labor employed on this Work in order that they may be available for inspection by the Owner, Administrator, or the Architect.
- **C.** Apprentices employed pursuant to this determination of wage rates must be registered and approved by the State Apprenticeship Council wherever rates for journeymen or apprentices are not listed.
- **D.** Pay reserve police officers employed on the Work the prevailing rate of wages paid to regular police officers as required by M.G.L. c149, Sec. 34B, as amended. Such police officers shall be covered by Workmen's Compensation Insurance and Employers Liability Insurance by the Contractor.
- E. The Contractor and all subcontractors shall, on a weekly basis throughout the term of the contract, provide to the City of Newton certified payroll affidavits verifying compliance with M.G.L. c.149, Sec. 27, 27A and 27B. The Contractor is obiligated to provide such records to the City directly on a weekly basis. The City may assess a penalty of \$100 for each day beyond the required submission date that such records are received, which amount shall be deducted from any amounts to the Contractor from the City. In the event of chronic late submissions, the City shall report the same to the Office of the Attorney General.
- **F.** The Contractor and all subcontractors shall provide a Statement of Compliance within 15 days of the completion of its portion of the work. This statement shall be submitted to the Owner on the form found elsewhere in this section.
- **G.** The Contractor shall maintain accurate and complete records, including payroll records, during the Contract term and for three years thereafter.

- An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule if it has not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK projects (bid oursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.
- The wages chedules hall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wage schedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wage schedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or a subcontractor
- Apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Mass achusetts Division of Apprentice Standards (DAS). Apprentices must keep their apprentice identification card on their persons during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wages chedule. Any apprentice not registered with DAS regardless of whether they are registered with a nother federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the
- Every contractor or subcontractor working on the construction project must submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports to DLS. For a sample payroll reporting form go to http://www.mass.gov/dob/pw.
- Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wages chedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953.
- Contractors must obtain the wages chedules from awarding authorities. Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing wage nates listed on the wage schedule to all employees who perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and criminal penalties.
- Employees not receiving the prevailing wage rate set forth on the wage schedule may file a complaint with the Fair Labor Division of the office of the Attorney General at (617) 727-3465.
