**Clerk's Note:** The item was approved in the Zoning & Planning Committee after a lot of lively dialogue. When the ordinance started out, it was very vague, but it has been fleshed out. The biggest concern was from the Commissioner of ISD who questioned the enforceability of it. The item was in Finance strictly to discuss the fines. The fine that was recommended was \$100 a day for the first through seventh days; \$200 a day for the eight through fourteenth days; and \$300 a day after that.

Concern was raised that the Inspectional Services Department could not enforce the Ordinance. The problem is by and large you are dealing with people with mental health issues. There are other ways to deal with this through other departments, ordinances, and task and advisory groups. To punish someone who already has a problem and try to fix it with a zoning violation is a problem. The risk of this to be used by neighbors against each other is a problem. The issue is a small one here in Newton, maybe a dozen properties in total.

Neighbors have pleaded for a while with Aldermen to get abutting properties cleaned up so that they can enjoy their own property. Nothing has been done. This ordinance is based on similar ordinances in surrounding communities and the language of this ordinance has been reviewed in great detail with the Law Department. The City currently does not have a tool to deal with the issue when the Hoarding Task Force does not work, or the pleas of the neighbors fall on deaf ears.

A motion to postpone the item until the Board meeting on June 16 was requested in order to get a transcript of the Commissioner of Inspectional Services comments from the February 2, 2014 Zoning & Planning Committee meeting. The motion was seconded and the Board approved the motion by a Unanimous Voice Vote.
