Today's unofficial results include all mail-in ballots, early voting ballots and all votes cast today. Newton Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee (UOCAVA) ballots and provisional ballots will be counted by hand and added to the official tally. The official tally will be certified by the Election Commission on Friday or Saturday. (Click here for information on provisional ballots.)

As of tonight, 27%, or 15,884 of the City's 59,672 registered voters cast ballots in today's primary. In the last State Primary in 2020 (which included contested races for our United States Senate and Congress), 50% of the City's 61,354 registered voters cast ballots.
