Need Help Paying For College?

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is now open and accepting applications. It is highly recommended that all college bound young people complete the FAFSA. This application determines eligibility for federal and state aid (loans), grants, scholarships, and work study. The Massachusetts Educational Financing Authority (MEFA) offers FREE workshops, one-on-one support, and information about college financing and the FAFSA application.

NEW APPLICANTS can now apply online for the 2022-2023 heating season.



October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Are you up to date on your breast cancer screening? Early detection saves lives! Mammograms can often show a breast lump before it can be felt. Contact your healthcare provider to schedule an appointment.

- Women 40 and older should have mammograms every 1 or 2 years.
- Women who are younger than 40 and have risk factors for breast cancer should ask their healthcare provider whether mammograms are advisable and how often to have them.



While mammograms can help you to detect cancer before you can feel a lump, breast self-exams help you to be familiar with how your breasts look and feel so you can alert your healthcare professional if there are any changes. Learn how to do a self-exam here.

Child Tax Credit & Stimulus Payment

If your household did not receive the child tax credit or third stimulus payments from 2021, there's still time to claim those benefits for eligible families!

Households with low or no income can complete a simplified tax filing tool at <u>GetCTC.org</u>. The deadline to apply is **November 15**th!

Looking for a COVID-19 Booster Dose?

Find updated bivalent COVID-19 boosters at multiple locations in Newton and



across the Commonwealth including where you received previous vaccines like doctor's offices, hospitals, pharmacies, and statewide vaccination sites. Find a location near you at <u>vaxfinder.mass.gov</u>.

Massachusetts also offers in-home COVID-19 vaccinations for anyone who has difficulty getting to or using a community clinic, including young children. In-home vaccination appointments can be scheduled by calling (833) 983-0485, Monday through Friday, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Appointments can also be scheduled directly on the CDR Health Patient Portal page at patientportalma.com.
