




- A potential increase of 22 52 hours / week the building will be open.



NUMBER OF OVERRIDES SINCE 2000





^{*} Watertown and Waltham both have higher levels of new growth, which has helped obviate the need for an override.

Between FY2019-FY2023, Watertown's new growth averaged 4.85% and Waltham's averaged 2.58%, compared to Newton's 1.65%.
