







## **Roadway Conditions**

- Anticipated Average PCI of 80 in the next 5 years


51% of the roads in need of rehabilitation










PEDESTRIAN INFRASTRUCTURE

## **Sidewalk Inventory Results**

- 414 miles of sidewalk infrastructure were evaluated and mapped (todate)
  - Excellent/Good = 38%
  - Fair = 42%
  - Poor/Replace = 20%
- The City of Newton maintains approximately 5,100\* curb ramps







## **Pedestrian Activity Map**


- Results show where pedestrian activity will most likely occur
- Assists with prioritizing repairs and provide the most value to the community
- We will also utilize crash/accident data for prioritization of projects



PEDESTRIAN NETWORK IMPROVEMENTS

## **Major Sidewalk Construction**

- Mileage by Year
  - 2017 = 2.60 miles
  - 2018 = 8.34 miles
  - 2019 = 8.39 miles
  - 2020 = 6.29 miles
  - 2021 = 8.33 miles
- Number of Curb Ramps by Year
  - 2017 = 55
  - 2018 = 164
  - 2019 = 56
  - 2020 = 89
  - 2021 = 179



#### **NUMBER OF OVERRIDES SINCE 2000**





<sup>\*</sup> Watertown and Waltham both have higher levels of new growth, which has helped obviate the need for an override.

Between FY2019-FY2023, Watertown's new growth averaged 4.85% and Waltham's averaged 2.58%, compared to Newton's 1.65%.
