A MOTION TO AMEND THE FEES TO \$220 PER CLEAN-OUT/\$225 FOR EMERGENCY SERVICE WAS APPROVED 19 YEAS, 4 NAYS (Ald. Ciccone, Gentile, Merrill, Salvucci), 1 ABSENT (Ald. Shapiro)

A MOTION TO APPROVE THE ITEM AS AMENDED WAS APPROVED 21 YEAS, 3 NAYS (Ald. Ciccone, Merrill, Salvucci)

Notes: The Mayor's recommendations were to limit the regularly scheduled sewer clean-outs to two days per week and to raise the cost to \$150.00 per visit. Limiting the number of days per week would free up the team to do other work in the Department of Public Works. The emergency clean-out fee would be \$200. If there was a determination that the problem was caused by the City then the fee would be waived.

It was noted by the chair of Finance that the Board has a memo from the Law Department that confirmed that the Board had the ability to increase the fee if they so choose. He stated that majority of the discussion in Finance was on the fee and that there was a recommendation for a fee of \$220 and \$225 for emergency cleanouts, however, the Committee approved the Mayor's recommendation of \$150/\$200.

Ald. Freedman noted that this service is offered by several companies within the city at a much higher cost. He made a motion to set fees based on the actual cost of providing the service. This would provide a fee of \$220 for regular and \$225 for overtime cleanouts. He noted that this would enable the City to offer this service without losing money in the process.

There was concern that the proposed amended rate structure did not encourage individuals to take advantage of the service, but rather to wait until it was an emergency, because there was little difference in the regular and emergency rates. Ald. Freedman responded that the cost to provide the service was \$220 and that the City should be covering the cost.

Ald. Fuller noted that this service is being used by only a few private homeowners to clean out their privately owned pipes. A fee is the appropriate way to go with this service as it does not benefit the majority of the residents. It should be charged at the full cost.

A motion to approve the amended rates was approved 19 Yeas, 4 nays (Ald. Ciccone, Gentile, Merrill, Salvucci), 1 Absent (Ald. Shapiro).

Ald. Lappin spoke on the main item and noted that the next step should be eliminating this service. She stated that the City should not be a competitor of commercial clean-out services. The employees that are working on this service should be working on other Public Works Department projects.

Ald. Ciccone and Salvucci voiced their opposition to raising the fee. They felt that the City should not be increasing fees at this time. People pay taxes and they should get the services.

Ald. Albright noted that this service is only provided to a very very small number of households.

A motion was made to approve the item as amended. It was approved 21 yeas, 3 nays (Ald. Ciccone, Merrill, Salvucci)
