Walked perimeter and interior of golf course, noting conditions/changes from previous year, and taking photos.

Grounds are in similar state as in previous year.

Dirt, chip, and leaf piles placed by woods in central area. [waypoint 1]

Firewood stack near central storage area appears larger. [waypoint 2]

Gravel piles maintained along cart path near 3rd tee. [waypoint 3]

The main culvert seems to be in the same state as observed in previous years. No proposed addition to the maintenance building, as noted in previous years.

Invasive Bittersweet still along fence near the 12th tee, and fairway. [waypoint 4] Normal fallen branches and leaf accumulation.

Golf course may be running out of space in the central debris composting area, and has created more piles in the central wooded area and along the perimeter woods. [waypoint 5] [waypoint 6] - culvert repair still needed, as previously noted. [waypoint 7]
