Gatehouse exterior seemed cleaner and in better shape, but ivy is regrowing up brick wall on sides and back. Debris in reservoir has been removed. About ten young trees planted near surrounding roadways. Welcoming signage with rules has been installed. Plants growing through fence have been trimmed back to fence line.

9. List any natural alterations since the last monitoring visit, (i.e., flooding, fire, insect infestations, tree damage, invasive plants, etc.). Note the location(s) on the route map and attach maps, photographs, and illustrations as helpful.

Invasive plants inside the fence have multiplied in spite of invasive pull by Newton Conservators in October of 2021. Plants included Tree of Heaven, Glossy Buckthorn, Black Swallow-wort, etc.

Some erosion on grassy slope.

Repeating comment from 2021 CR report:

Vegetation growth on reservoir wall. Roots continue to damage wall, cutting back every few years is apparently not sufficient for long term health of wall. Newton Parks, Recreation and Culture Dept. (PRC) needs to MAKE A PRIORITY for a long term plan for wall maintenance. May require a joint consultation with a civil engineer and vegetation maintenance contractor. Luis was not with us on the visit so we were unable to learn if PRC has made progress on this priority.
