Sec. 5-55. Composition, appointment and compensation of members.

- (a) Voting membership. The design review committee shall consist of twelve (12) permanent voting members, four (4) appointed by the mayor, four (4) selected by the board of aldermen, and four (4) selected by the school committee. There shall be two (2) additional voting members for each facility under design review, who are community representatives who shall represent the interests of the community in which the proposed facility is to be located, and who reside in the immediate area of the facility. One community representative shall be appointed by the mayor and one shall be selected by the board of aldermen. In the event that more than one facility shall comprise a project, and where the board of aldermen determines that the resulting number of community representatives for said project is unreasonably large, it may reduce the total number of community representatives required to not fewer than two. - (b) <u>Nonvoting membership</u>. There shall be the following nonvoting members of the design review committee: <u>one alderman</u>, <u>one school committee member for school department building projects</u>, the <u>planning director or his designee</u>, the <u>head of the using agency or his designee</u>, and the <u>public buildings commissioner or his designee</u>. The public buildings commissioner shall also serve as secretary of the design review committee. (Rev. Ords. 1973,
