Newton Athletic Fields Foundation

PETITION: 12/12/2020

Newton needs a multi-year athletic fields improvement program to:

- ✓ Rehabilitate fields in disrepair
- Construct synthetic turf fields
- ✓ Increase maintenance to support usage levels
- ✓ Configure and allocate fields based on demand (not history)
- ✓ Install additional field lighting

We seek a formal commitment from the Mayor's office, City Council and Parks, Recreation & Culture (PR&C) department to:

- \checkmark Allocate capital and operating funds
- Commit to a multi-year plan (dates, deliverables, budget, resources)
- ✓ Charge market-rate rental fees and direct them to field maintenance
- ✓ Commit Community Preservation Act (CPA) funds annually
- ✓ Dedicate the required resources to both deliver improvements and maintain existing fields
















